## Mr. Hunter Merritt, Study Manager Sacramento District Planning Division Water Resources Branch



Hunter Merritt is a Study Manager for the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) Sacramento District Planning Division, Water Resources Branch, Watershed Assessment and Ecological Restoration section.

Mr. Merritt began his career with the Corps in 2009 as a Public Affairs specialist, with a focus on community relations. In 2011, he moved to the district's Planning Division, where his planning work has focused on public participation and engagement, as well as plan formulation. In addition to traditional planning roles (lead planner on both the Lower Cache Creek and Lower San Joaquin Feasibility Studies) and supporting others in large dam safety projects (recreation planner on the Isabella Dam Safety Modification Project), he has worked extensively with the Floodplain Management Services (FPMS) Program, completing several non-structural flood risk communication projects in collaborative partnership with the California Department of Water Resources (DWR), with a goal of increasing public awareness of flood exposure through outreach and education.

Mr. Merritt has served as a charette facilitator for more than a dozen feasibility studies nationwide, working to actualize the changes of the Civil Works Transformation process by re-scoping studies to meet the goals of the Corps' planning modernization paradigm. He is also a trainer for all levels of the Corps leadership development program (LDP), and a graduate of the regional LDP Level III (2014), where he worked extensively with enterprise-wide issues of Knowledge Management and Transfer.
