South Dakota's recreation areas vary from primitive to highly developed and provide many opportunities to enjoy the state.

Oahe Dam takes its name from the Oahe Indian Mission established among the Lakota Sioux Indians in 1874. Lake Oahe extends from Pierre, SD to Bismarck, ND. The lake is 231 miles long and has 2,250 miles of shoreline. The 51 recreation areas located around the reservoir offer camping, picnicking, fishing, hunting, boating, water skiing, swimming, bird watching, hiking, biking and photography opportunities.

Winter activities at Cold Brook/Cottonwood include ice fishing, skating and cross-country skiing along with summer activities like canoeing, fishing, swimming and wildlife viewing.
