SUBJECT: Sign Standards Manual Revision

1. I am pleased to announce the availability of the newly revised U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Sign Standards Manual, EP 310-1-6a. It is available in digital format on the web. The Corps sign standards continue to reinforce a consistent and easily identifiable brand at all our facilities, provide information that enhances the experience of our visitors, and help to provide for the safety of visitors and employees.
2. This is the first complete revision of the Sign Manual in several years and represents years of experience and improvements in the sign program. Most chapters have been extensively revised with new signs and more accurate information. Among the additions to the manual are references to the U.S. Department Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the U.S. Coast Guard Aids to Navigation.
