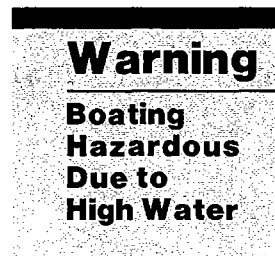
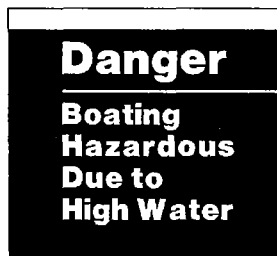

SUBJECT: Addition to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Sign Standards Program –
Approval of New Danger and Warning Signs for High Water Situations

1. Upon the recommendation of the Sign Advisory Work Group and the National Sign Program Manager, a sign reading: Danger or Warning / Boating / Hazardous / Due to / High Water has been added to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Sign Standards Manual (EP 310-1-6a and 6b). The following graphic of the new signs will go into the manual, the new software and be posted on the Natural Resources Management Gateway: <http://corpslakes.us/sign>.



2. These signs are intended for temporary use and must be removed as soon as the hazards no longer exist. Manual pages 2.14 and 2.15 provide the definitions for when to use each type of sign. Danger signs indicate immediate or grave danger, while warning signs call attention to a potential danger.
