SUBJECT: Sign Standards Program – Approval of New Danger/Thin Ice/Keep Off Sign

1. Upon the recommendation of the Sign Advisory Work Group and the National Sign Program Manager, a new safety sign reading: Danger/Thin Ice/Keep Off has been added to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Sign Standards Manual (EP 310-1-6a and 6b). The following graphic of the new sign will go into the manual, the Corps SignPro software, and be posted on the Natural Resources Management Gateway, www.corpslakes.us/sign.



2. The intent for this new sign is that it be posted at specific locations that have a consistent condition of thin ice during the winter, such as channels and outflows. For general warning, the existing sign WRN-13, “Caution/Unsafe Ice Conditions May Exist” should be used.
