	Be sure photographs of activities on or near the water depict properly sized and properly buckled life jackets.	
	Photographers are encouraged to set digital cameras to their highest resolution possible.	
	Close-up images of people should be accompanied by a signed DD Form 2830 (general talent release) www.dtic.mil/whs/directives/infomgt/forms/eforms/dd2830.pdf or district equivalent.	
	Photos with date stamps will not be accepted.

For help manipulating your photo, most District Public Affairs offices have personnel with better quality photo software that enables them to manipulate dpi; however, they must have a high resolution photo to start with.
