


Research and Writing Program


USACE History Poster

Oral History Program

- Single most effective program
- Captures information and voices not found in official records
- CEHO collection includes 3,000 interviews
- CEHO resources training, sample questions, transcription





Research Collection

- Extensive document, photograph, and map collection
- Hidden resource, available to USACE, researchers
- Selective digitization program – preservation, web, and publications
- Challenge to identify, collect, and arrange born digital content





Historical Collection



- USACE's historical collection part of CEHO
- Artifact collection valuable

- Military heavy, looking for better non military coverage
- Work with Engineer

 Wood









Field History Program

- CEHO tasked with assisting USACE field activities preserve their histories
- Twofold process
 - ▶ Help collect source material and conduct oral history interviews; and assist with contract histories
- Field history program is vehicle for CEHO working with NRM
- Challenge is finding best way to make history assessable to you
