Fundraising, sponsoring, collaborating

 Associations can be advocates for USACE. Some can lobby if they are established with that mission.

### **Top 10 Things to Make Your CA Great**

- Have all major user groups on your board
- Have an up to date CA Agreement that allows for maximum support of the park and its missions.
- Go to every Board Meeting (Yes, that means the Park Manager and Park Rangers)
- Communicate your needs and listen to their concerns.
- Try new things and enjoy the power of saying YES.



# Top 10 Things to Make Your CA Great Cont...

- Have a gift shop/sales outlet = take home value
- Fund Raise. Find someone great at it.
- Support staff morale—coffee & danish at the VA Refresher
- Support your volunteer village and program. Dividends are too numerous to count.
- When you have enough \$\$, encourage them to pay for Executive Director; volunteers burn out.



### Friends of Caesar Creek

FOCC began in 1985, with \$300 and 30 members, now FOCC has 65 members with a average balance of \$112,000.

 They support the educational, scientific, and historical activities of the region by offering various workshops and programs and operating regional interest book carts and educational materials at the Caesar Creek Lake Visitor Center.

Construction of a new playground facility at the existing recreation area at Caesar Creek Lake Visitor Center.








### **FOCC Partner for Fitness Trail Handshake**







In 2014 FOCC donated a \$50,000 visitor orientation film that was professionally produced by their contractors.








## **Libby Dam Cooperating Association**

- Have a system of checks and balances
- Rome was not built in a day






### **Libby Dam Cooperating Association**
