## Communities of Practice (CoP) are the People

- Each CoP is learning how to communicate inside the agency & outside

## Tools to assist CoPs communicate

- The Natural Resources Management (NRM) Gateway is a repository of knowledge created by the NRM CoP.
- The Operations & Regulatory Gateway is being modeled after some of the principles of the NRM Gateway.

## Headquarters Information Management (HQ IM)

- Has leased two tools that they will license out to help CoPs communicate
  - Tomoye Simplify
  - Groove
- Our plan -- Operations & Regulatory Gateway will incorporate these tools into their web presence



The Smart Book listings are a subset of the NRM CoP members. Not a CoP substitute.





## **Smartbook Objectives**


- Identify employees responsible for program area (supervisor directed)


- For the Citizen

- Consistent Look & Feel for recreation opportunity



## What's Next - Groove

- Groove is a communications tool for Project Delivery Teams
- Designed to serve groups of 25 or less
- Allows for threaded discussion and chat room conversations
- Allows review by multiple editors (virtual documents work)
- Allows "Place Ware" type presentations of PowerPoint files

### Groove – it is:

Encrypted (safe for communications)

Powerful, useful

Licensed product (Corps has 20,000)

Available to Corps partners

Ours for the next 7 years

### Who should have Groove

- If you are an Operations Project Manager
- If you are on a national PDT
- If you need to have encrypted conversations
- If you want to use Groove as a training tool to share PowerPoint files
- If you want to share directories, files that can not be sent via email
- If you want to work on word files virtually

You should get Groove

## What you should know about Groove

- · You are in control
- It functions like a second email system to be checked
- There is no Information Management (IM) backup at this time – due in 2005
- You invite attendees no one but invitees is aware of workspace
- A copy of the files you place in the workspace is placed on the computers of all attendees – File Management is of concern
- If you delete the workspace, it is deleted from all invitees computers (unless directory sharing)
- Make sure CFMS works after Groove is installed (some difficulty for some systems)

## Operations Starting Point Workspace

- I will be creating a workspace for Operations Senior Policy and Sub-CoP leaders to begin working
- I will ask each of the Sub-CoPs leaders for their recommendations for license holders and development of other Workspaces
- I will post Groove information on the Forums page of the Operations Gateway


### **Groove process**


- Request License (one per email account up to 5 machines per license)
- Install Groove on computer with min. 10 megs free (we recommend a couple of Gigs min.)
- Join ongoing workspace to become familiar with properties (Attend training where available)
- Begin sharing note if you want others to know about a product produced in Groove you must send it to someone with a Tomoye License or a webmaster (Operations - Virginia Dickerson, webmaster)

### **Groove Launch Bar**

- Workspaces and Contacts
- Invite other Groove users –
   (recommended they have
   Groove installed on their
   computers before invitation
   sent use Groove Directory
   rather than CE Outlook)
- Minimum of 2 mangers recommended







## Tomoye

- Is the publishing tool to post to the web
- Limited by the number of licenses (2,000)
- Limited by protocol within the CoP for posting authority

- Active Directory and Share Point are in process
- Autonomy search engine is on the way
