D. Describe your partnership and the proposed Handshake Partnership Project:

Project applications will be evaluated on the categories below. Please complete each section as appropriate.

Summary Statement:

Damsite 6 West Park (6W) on the Arkansas River provides a variety of recreational opportunities to visitors that includes fishing, boating, biking and hiking. The partnership we are creating with Pulaski County Public Works (PCPW), the University of Arkansas System Cooperative Extension Service (UAEX), and Quail Forever (Pheasants Forever) will include purchasing and installing a pre-fabricated concrete vault restroom and creating a trailhead to facilitate the influx of visitors. Bike lanes are currently installed on roads leading into 6W Park and PCPW has future plans to create a 3-mile river bike trail along the top of the levee from 6W Park to the Clinton National Airport, as well as upgrading the infrastructure to include installing waterlines to the park for water bottle filling stations, and installing a bike repair stand. USACE, Quail Forever and UAEX are currently working to form a partnership to restore native plants, beneficial to pollinators and wildlife and to improve the aesthetic and educational value of the park.

Handshake Funding Cost Break Down:

CXT Double Vault Pre-fabricated concrete bathroom - \$25,000

Longevity / O&M description:

CXT concrete pre-fabricated restrooms have a life span of more than 20 years, are vandal resistant, and have a 150 mph wind load, according to the company's website. Pulaksi County Public Works will complete the site preparation before the restroom arrives. PCPW will also maintain the facility after installation to include cleaning, vault pumping and any additional maintanence. USACE will benefit from the addition of this restroom by eliminating costs associated with the rental, cleaning and pumping of a portable toilet that is currently located in the park. This project will likely pay for itself within 1.5 years.

A five-acre pollinator plot will also be installed with self-seeding native plants and flowers. Quail Forever and UAEX will provide recommendations on seed mixes and site preparation. Quail Forever will also provide management plans and technical assistance on how to prepare and manage the site after it becomes established. Installation of a native prairie landscape would be more cost efficient and provide habitat and forage for area fauna, while reducing operation and maintenance costs associated with mowing.

Partnership Value:

Pulaski County Public Works has partnered with USACE successfully by asissting with park maintenance for the last year. PCPW wants to continue improving the park and are actively seeking other grants to assist with the cost of the restroom, trailhead and pollinator/wildlife plots. Improving the current recreation area and providing a restroom facility will significantly improve the visitors' recreation experience and increase visitation. This particular effort will strengthen an already established partnership and instill a sense of community pride. Partnering with Quail Forever and with UAEX is critical to the project because it provides all groups involved with an area for increasing public awareness and education about the decline of suitable wildlife habitat and the conservation of pollinators.

Recreational Benefit:

This restroom will benefit the recreating public by providing a more sanitary and comfortable facility for visitors to use. The only restroom in the park is a single portable toilet. Adding a permanent restroom will be more inviting to families, elderly park visitors and will be ADA compliant. This improvement in the park will increase visitation by meeting the basic needs of all visitors. The native plants and improved habitat will improve aesthetics as well as create a better opportunity for wildlife watchers.

Environmental Stewardship Value:

Having this partnership will add to our environmental stewardship program by replacing invasive plant species with native plants. Also, we are already collaborating with subject matter experts in range management and native plant restoration for quail with Quail Forever and the Extension Service and we anticipate that the pollinator plot will be a rewarding project to native fauna and the partners involved.

Communication & Education Value:

The improvements to the park are beneficial to UAEX and to Quail Forever in similar ways. It provides an area for the public to see and learn about how pollinators and other wildlife are benefiting from the improved habitat. It gives rangers an area to conduct interpretive programs about the environmental stewardship aspect of their jobs. Interpretive signage will be used to explain how the wildlife and pollinators are benefitting from this work. Having a restroom in this area creates the opportunity to conduct more intensive environmental stewardship programs, such as hosting school outdoor science events that may include Bio-blitzes and surveys and inventories.

Innovativeness:

This project is geared to bring more people into the park for a quality outdoor experience. Adding the bathroom will improve their recreation experience and encourage others to visit by having comfortable and sanitary facilities. There are no other public access points in the area with a restroom available. The addition of a bathroom and creation of a trailhead at the park will be truly one of a kind for the area. These improvements will help us in our efforts to be good stewards while providing new opportunities to the public.

Conclusion:

This project will provide better recreating opportunities and will create better wildlife habitat at Damsite 6 West Park. The knowledge, experience, and contributions the University of Arkansas System Cooperative Extension Service, Quail Forever, and Pulaski County Public Works are bringing to the project are critical to its success by providing an area for the public to see and learn about pollinators and by providing a comfortable and sanitary new restroom facility.
