D. Describe your partnership and the proposed Handshake Partnership Project:

Project applications will be evaluated on the categories below. Please complete each section as appropriate.

Summary Statement:

This project will construct a new mountain bike and hiking trail system named Highlander Trail, under a collective partnership between the Corps, Southwest Kentucky Mountain Bike Association (SWKyMBA), Cave Country Trails, Friends of Barren River Lake and State Park, and Glasgow Lions Club. This will be the first mtn. bike trail in Barren County and will be a welcomed improvement to the land-based recreational infrastructure of the region. Due to the proximity of the State Resort Park and 10,000 acres of water at BRL, this project will have a positive impact on the eco-tourism of the area and encourage folks to reconnect with the great outdoors. Highlander Trail will be the latest improvement to a growing mtn. bike mecca in south-central KY. The trail corridor has been detail flagged and mapped by a professional trail builder to maximize the use of the land. This trail will be built using techniques to maximize the users' experience while maintaining the natural aesthetics of the recreation area. BRL has worked with SWKyMBA on the Twisted Oliver Trail at BRL and they have been instrumental in bringing Highlander from conceptual phase to the initiation of trail construction. The MOU with SWKyMBA has been updated to reflect the addition of Highlander and the responsibilities that SWKyMBA will take on to manage the trails in the future, which will keep the O&M costs to a bare minimum for the Corps.

Handshake Funding Cost Break Down:

The goal of this handshake application is to bring the Highlander Trail to fruition. The trail will be constructed in a hybrid build fashion, which will utilize a professional trail builder to "rough in" the trail and volunteer labor to put the finishing touches to the trail surface. Utilizing this approach, we can get a professionally designed trail for less money. We estimate a professional builder will cost approximately \$11K per mile. The goal with this funding is to get the first loop of Highlander Trail (War Hammer Loop - ~4 miles) fully open and ready for use. We will then look at additional funding opportunities to build the second loop (Bagpipe Burner - ~4.6 miles) and have the entire trail system completed. We would utilize the \$25,000 of handshake grant funding exclusively for the contracting of a professional trail builder for War Hammer Loop.

Cost Break Down:

War Hammer Loop (Professional Trail Builder) - \$25,000

Longevity / O&M description:

This trail will serve Barren County and the vistors to our area for years to come. SWKyMBA has a very proven track record of not only building the miles of multi-use hike/bike trails in southern KY, but also maintaining the trails that they help build. SWKyMBA put in over 1,800 hours in the construction of the 3.5 mile Twisted Oliver Trail at BRL and has also invested 182 hours of volunteer labor into trail maintenance at BRL so far. The Highlander Trail system will be constructed using International Mountain Bike Association standards for trail construction, which will result in less overall maintenance over the lifetime of the trail and will help to maintain the natural environment to the utmost extent. Through the existing MOU with SWKyMBA, long-term O&M costs will be kept to a minimum for the Corps

Partnership Value:

Barren River Lake has a long-term relationship with SWKyMBA, Friends of Barren River Lake and State Park, and the Glasgow Lions Club. The partnership with Cave Country Trails would be new to BRL, but is a very valuable addition. Cave Country Trails has been instrumental in the region with promoting trails of all uses and they plan to promote the addition of new "Trail Town" designations in the area. SWKyMBA has already invested 50 hours in the design and scope of Highlander. It is estimated that an additional 1,800 hours will be invested by SWKyMBA on the construction of War Hammer Loop. SWKyMBA has also pledged \$20,000 towards the construction of this trail. The Corps will provide trail building tools, equipment, PPE, and contract execution. The Handshake Funding will provide the contracted labor to build War Hammer Loop at Highlander Trail.

Recreational Benefit:

The project involves the development of 140 acres of land adjacent to the Barren River Lake State Resort Park. The addition of this recreational opportunity to an area of the lake that already sees over 250,000 visitors per year, will allow for the optimal utilization of the trail by all of the target user groups (mountain bikers, hikers, cross-country/trail runners, and nature observers). When completed, Highlander Trail will be a 8.6 mile multi-use trail that will be family-friendly, yet still have technical features that will make it attractive to users of all skill levels. The breathtaking views of the lake coupled with the beautiful natural environment of the area will make this trail a memorable recreation experience for visitors. With an overall visitation of approximately 1.4 million per year to BRL, this trail has the potential to offer a recreational benefit to a multitude of users. By adding an assest like Highlander Trail to the BRL area, we are creating a recreational experience for generations to enjoy.

Environmental Stewardship Value:

The primary purpose of this trail may be to provide a new recreational opportunity, but with the use of proper trail building techniques, we are also providing an opportunity for users to see the benefits of keeping the importance of environmental stewardship at the forefront of everything that we do as land managers. The trail has been laid out by a professional trail builder to use the natural contours of the land and keep tree removal to a bare minimum. We want to reconnect people with the natural environment, not disrupt the pristine nature of the habitat that already exists. Every step in the process of moving this trail forward has been with environmental stewardship in mind.

Communication & Education Value:

We plan to use this trail for nature hikes and incorporate it into our interpretative services that we provide to the recreating public. It is our vision to have native wildflower walks, tree identification talks, and other environmental stewardship programs as part of this trail coming to fruition. The trailhead kiosk will have informatiuon posted on proper trail etiquette, monitoring trail conditions, and the "Leave no Trace" prinicipal of packing out what you bring in to the area. We will also be able to discuss the purpose of Flood Risk Management, Natural Resource Management, and the important role that each one of us plays in protecting our environment.

Innovativeness:

The addition of Highlander Trail will be the only of its size within a 50 mile radiu and will add a recreatrional opportunity that currently does not exist in Barren County. It is a unique opportunity to revitalize an area of the lake that is adjacent to the State Resort Park and provide a new opportunity for visitors to enjoy beautiful Barren River Lake. The partnership that we have with SWKyMBA is one that we take great pride in. They are true trail stewards and see the value in bringing this recreational opportunity to Barren County. This will be the first handshake grant at BRL to include this many partners. In doing so, we believe that this shows the community involvement in making sure that this trail comes to fruition.

Conclusion:

The addition of this multi-use trail at Barren River Lake will be a great assest to the eco-tourism of the area. This will be the first trail of its kind in Barren County and will improve infrastructure for land-based recrational opportunities at BRL. This funding will be instrumental in bringing Highlander Trail to fruition and will help to further strengthening the great partnerships that exist at BRL.
