HARRY S. TRUMAN DAM & RESERVOIR HANDSHAKE PARTNERSHIP ROADSIDE PARK

Harry S. Truman Dam & Reservoir is the proud recipient of the 2023 Handshake Partnership Program funding \$25,000 for upgrades to the roadside park at the confluence of the Sac & Osage Rivers.

The Handshake Project that was recently concluded had eight partners, with approximately \$115,355 in partner funding. Special thanks to our partners: Missouri Department of Transportation, Boy Scouts of America-Heart of America Council, Sons of Confederate Veterans, Osceola Optimist Club, Osceola Chamber of Commerce, City of Osceola, and the Village of Roscoe. The project involved park maintenance and improvements such as selective tree removal and trimming, rehabilitation of the stone staircase, paved parking lots, new signage on the roadside, solar lighting for the parking areas, a viewing telescope, new grill, and picnic tables. The Roadside Park is located two miles southwest of Osceola, MO along Highway 82.

This project has been a long time coming with several of the partners working with us since the early 2000s. This park means a great deal to the community having been built in 1937 under the guidance of the Works Progress Administration (WPA) and the Reservoir not being completed until October of 1979. This park like the community has seen a lot of changes in it's time. Now with these efforts being made together with the community this park is sure to be around for the next 80 years!
