DeGray Lake Watchable Wildlife Interpretive Trail Handshake Partnership Agreement

In 2016, the Corps entered a Handshake Partnership Agreement with Keeping DeGray Lake Beautiful to construct an accessible trail and natural surface trail for the Lower Lake Area at DeGray Lake, Arkansas.

Before

Our Lower Lake Area has been receiving improvements such as a disc golf course, exercise course and under brushing. However the only accessible type areas are the pavilion and roadways themselves. The area itself, though very recreational, was not wheelchair or stroller friendly and did not offer a variety of scenic beauty.

During

The Corps has worked with KDLB in providing materials, labor and equipment for preparing the trail. This project worked with many individuals and companies to accomplish the task. Clark County Road Department hauled in the trail bed materials and helped with the trail bed work specifically in trail compaction. Iron Mountain Lodge and Marina manager David Egleston graciously volunteered his time and equipment in helping prepare the trail and to spread the base material along the trail in preparation for the asphalt company to lay the asphalt base. KDLB worked on getting the accessible observation pier built and tied into the asphalt trail for easy access to the water area. DLT Events, Fred Phillips donated his time and expertise in natural trail building to help finish out the natural surface trail area. Areas throughout the trail have been planted with wildflowers for pollinators. Benches and swings are currently being placed throughout for the finishing touches on the trail.

After

Thanks to the Handshake Partnership Program, together we are creating a universally accessible trail, allowing people of all abilities to enjoy the natural wildlife at DeGray Lake along with a continuation natural surface trail. Interpretive programs from all types of schools and community groups will now be able to easily access the area to view local wildlife and our natural scenic beauty. Because of this Handshake project, visitors with physical disabilities can experience the natural wonders of DeGray Lake. The Human Development Center currently utilizes the trail for their Walk-A-Thon and helps to keep the trail clean. Arkadelphia Junior ROTC also utilizes the trail for their training and helps to keep the trail maintained also.
