### Report - FY 2019 Recipients

Jennings Randolph Lake 3-D archery course.

After the course was completed in 2016 it has been an exceptional addition to the recreational opportunities at the project. Each year since completion the Friends of Jennings Randolph Lake hosts two archery tournaments and one of the contributors host an archery tournament benefit Pulmonary Pacers for heart disease.

The ranger staff has hosted its 4th annual Field Day for kids. The project partnered with West Virginia Natural Resource Police, the FOJRL, Three Rivers Guiding owner Eli Whetzel, the Friends of Jennings Randolph Lake, NWTF, and volunteers Billy Foster and Frank and Toni Quesenberry.

Five hands on field stations are set up and the kids along with their parents rotated every half hour. Instructions were given on animal track casting, WV NRP Laser Shot and gun safety, archery, NWTF id and gun safety and fishing at the Kalbaugh pond with instruction. The project generally hosts 40 kids and parents participated. The event brought together kids and adults and natural resource partners to share education, fun, and outdoor recreational activities.
