

JEFF KRAUSE - is an Institute for Water Resources (IWR) employee and serves as the Environmental Stewardship Program and Business Line Manager for Headquarters USACE. Mr. Krause serves as a Senior Policy advisor to provide direction and guidance from a national perspective to the field for the Corps comprehensive stewardship program on 12 million acres of Corps land and waters. Responsibilities include budget and workplan development, Stewardship remaining items manager, policy and guidance development, interagency liason, and coordination with ASA(CW) and OMB. Previously, Jeff was a wildlife biologist with the Baltimore District where he was located at the Raystown Lake project for 15 years in central Pennsylvania.

Jeff's 24 years with the Corps includes part time work with the Corps Environmental Research and Development Center and four years in the Baltimore District office in planning and engineering where he work on ecosystem restoration. Jeff has formerly served as the original chairman of the Corps national Stewardship Advisory Team, a member of the Environmental Stewardship OMBIL users group and the Environmental Stewardship CATT team. Jeff is a 1990 graduate of California University of Pennsylvania with a Bachelors of Science in Environmental Conservation and also received his Masters of Science in Environmental Biology from Hood College in 1998.
