



Lynn Greer is an Outreach Program Specialist, and Great Lakes and Ohio River Division Public Involvement Specialist.

Ms. Greer began her career at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) in 1999 as an environmental scientist. Ms. Greer has served as the District Environmental Compliance Coordinator, Natural Resource Manager Liaison, Project Manager, Plan Formulator, Technical Manager for Dredged Material Management Plans, Great Lakes Restoration Initiative Outreach Program Specialist, and since 2007 she has been responsible for outreach and public relations within the Civil Works Program.

She is a graduate of the Great Lakes Leadership Development Program and was a representative of the Lakes and River Division Operations team that identified and recommended regionalization opportunities, developed uniform benchmark standards for the Operations Programs, and provided feedback on financial management issues. Ms. Greer served as Chairperson of the USACE National Stewardship Advisory Team from January 2006 through January 2007 and has been involved in several significant agency events: managed the Mount Morris Dam 50th Anniversary event in 2002, served as District liaison for the Lewis and Clark Bicentennial Commemoration from 2003 through 2006, and managed the Black Rock Lock Centennial open house in 2014. In addition, she represented USACE on the National Planning Committee for the International Coastal Zone Conference series in 2011 and was the Technical Program Chair responsible for scheduling the five day conference program, conference liaison for over 800 speakers from 24 countries, and compiled conference proceedings. Ms. Greer serves as a facilitator for the agency including a SMART Planning Charette facilitator. She has experience facilitating small groups ranging from 5 to 30 people and facilitating larger audiences of over 200 people. Relevant training experience includes: Introduction to Managing Environmental Conflict, Risk Communication Training, Conflict Management and Dispute Resolution, Consulting with Indian Nations, Public Involvement Communication, Public Involvement and Teaming in Planning, Collaboration Leadership for Environmental Professionals, Advanced Multi-Party Negotiation of Environmental Disputes, Introduction to Managing Environmental Conflict, and Foundations in Public Participation from the International Association for Public Participation. Ms. Greer is in the process of obtaining her Udall Certificate in Environmental Collaboration.
