OVERARCHING GUIDANCE

- An approved Master Plan is needed before any new development, construction, or land use change can be pursued
 - Exceptions possible in special situations
 - Outgrantees' actions must be compatible with the Master Plan
- May cover a single or several projects
 - Within the same Watershed or Management Region if appropriate
- Lead element responsible for MP development, review and revision is District Operations Division
 - Interoffice / Interdisciplinary team approach will be used
 - Coordination with other agencies and the public is integral to the process and is required under NEPA and other environmental laws





PRIMARY APPLICABLE REGULATIONS

- ER/EP 1130-2-540: Environmental Stewardship
- ER/EP 1130-2-550: Recreation Operations and Maintenance Guidance and Procedures

All of these documents should be followed and considered together to develop and maintain effective MP's and OMP's





APPLICATION OF ER/EP 1130-2-550 VS. ER 1105-2-100

Compare Planning Guidance Notebook (ER 1105-2-100) to ER/EP 1130-2-550, Chapter 3:

- The Planning Notebook provides guidance for <u>new</u> projects. The creation of a MP for a <u>new</u> project should follow the format in ER/EP 1130-2-550, Chapter 3 and shall be a collaborative effort between Planning and Operations
- The Planning Notebook regulation does **NOT** provide guidance to address the specific requirements of supplementing or revising a Master Plan as set forth in ER/EP 1130-2-550
