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MEMORANDUM FOR COMMANDERS, MAJOR SUBORDINATE COMMANDS

SUBJECT: Policies for Implementation of the National Recreation Reservation Service (NRRS)

- 1. A critical component in the development of the National Recreation Reservation Service (NRRS) Request for Information (RFP) is to define the dimensions of the inventory that prospective bidders will have to manage. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers policy for NRRS areas and facilities is as follows (based on ER 1130-2-404, Appendix A "Use Fee Criteria"):
- a. All Class A campgrounds and any campground that currently offers contract or local reservation services will be included in the NRRS.
- b. District Commanders will determine which Class B and C campgrounds and other recreation areas and facilities, e.g., day use picnic shelters, group camp areas, cabins, etc., will be included in the NRRS.
- c. District Commanders will make as many campsites as possible available for reservation, but not less than 60 percent of the campsites within a NRRS campground.
- 2. Request that you complete the inventory spreadsheet file that will be transmitted electronically to each division and district for all NRRS recreation areas, based on the above policies.
- 3. An advanced e-mailed division consolidated response, including the completed spreadsheets, should be transmitted to the Corps Program Manager, Mr. Jack Ardner, at the North Pacific Division, not later than 24 April 1996.
