Organizers Proclaim National Public Lands Day Best Yet

Volunteers Enhance Public Resources At Foscue Park

Demopolis, AL- Foscue Park received a well-needed boost when 275 volunteers donated 4 hours of their time to developing a wildlife interpretive trail, installing up wood duck nest boxes, building bird houses, litter pick up, seeding wildlife food plots, shoreline clean up and assembling park benches on National Public Lands Day, Saturday, September 20.

Foscue Park's NPLD project inspired volunteers from around this area. Among those dedicating their Saturday were volunteers from Alabama Power (Green Co. Steam Plant), Borden Chemical, several Cub Scout, Boy Scout and Girl Scout Troops, students from Demopolis City Schools, West Alabama Preparatory, University of West Alabama, members of the Lions Club, Kiwanis Club and individual family volunteers that are outdoor enthusiasts.
