

In 2015, Jeff Kresch, Jr. said he would love to become a volunteer for Tygart Lake. In May of 2016, Jeff came to Tygart Lake with 10 volunteers and performed a total of 80 volunteer hours. He assembled and led a cleanup at one of the hardest hit areas of Tygart. A dump truck load of tires were hauled away along with more than 50 bags of garbage.

On April 1, 2017, as a part of Tygart Lake's participation in West Virginia's "Make It Shine" statewide cleanup event, Jeff brought 11 other volunteers. They cleaned up even more tires and at least 30 bags of trash for a total of 88 hours of service.

Jeff has been a volunteer at Tygart Lake since 2015 and has volunteered for a total of 1500+ hours, while also volunteering for other partners of Tygart Lake. He has spent many hours cleaning up the Tygart River and its tributaries. Jeff has joined Save the Tygart Watershed group where he has served numerous hours and dedicated himself to clean waters in the Tygart River above and below the lake. Jeff has also been responsible for recruitment of more than 30 additional volunteers for cleanups, programming, and outreach efforts.

Jeff is a valuable volunteer at Tygart Lake. His efforts to keep the Tygart River and Tygart Lake clean and viable for safe drinking water and fisheries are commendable. His dedication and commitment to Tygart Lake and its environmental stewardship program is deserving of recognition.
