Greg and Jennifer have served as interpretive volunteers since April of 2019.

Since then, they have provided vital support to the USACE Water Safety Mission, providing over 140 hours of volunteer time directly related to water safety programing. Together, they have conducted over 330 prelaunch boat checks, conducted water safety programs at local schools, provided roving interpretation at the project's three beaches, and staff the Pennsylvania Welcome Center. They also provide the critical support

needed at special events.

When conducting interpretation and staffing the welcome center they explain all project purposes including flood risk management and water quality to the visiting public.

Kathy and Raymond "Chip" Parrill, who both hold full time jobs, have been volunteering at Jennings Randolph Lake since 2015. In their seven years of volunteering, they have donated 4,353 hours of service, with a value to the nation of \$122,000. Each week, they donate approximately 35 hours, which is equivalent to a full-time job. The Parrills serve as camp hosts where they are proactive in ensuring our visitors have everything they need to enjoy their time visiting our facilities. They are members of our Friends of Jennings Randolph Lake nonprofit group and serve as the group's president and treasurer. They have secured several community grants at a value of over \$130,000 to contribute to improvements such as building a new pavilion, installing a video screen for movies and presentations, installing a gazebo at the pond, remodeling the camp store, and installing a new playground.

They host annual car shows where the funds raised go directly to support the project's annual people with disabilities/wounded veteran deer and turkey hunts which provide outdoor recreational opportunities and support project wildlife management goals. Additionally, through their leadership, over 200 interpretive programs, covering conservation, wildlife rehabilitation, water safety, and recreation activities have been delivered to over 5,000 people.
