Summary:

The Lake Washington Ship Canal Natural Resource Management section manages USACE lands at the Montlake and Fremont Cuts for invasive vegetation, and Gardener Marena Yarnell has created the opportunity for volunteers from the public to work alongside our staff in restoration efforts. Beginning in November of 2024, this event has taken place on the second Saturday of every month, alternating between the two Cuts. NRM staff have been joined in the winter weather by 59 volunteers including the UW Men's Rowing team and a Seattle district employee. Since the Second Saturday Volunteer events have started, over 40 bags of English ivy and approximately an acre of other invasive species such as blackberry, *Clematis*, morning glory, etc. have been removed.
