# FAD FAMILY HISTORY

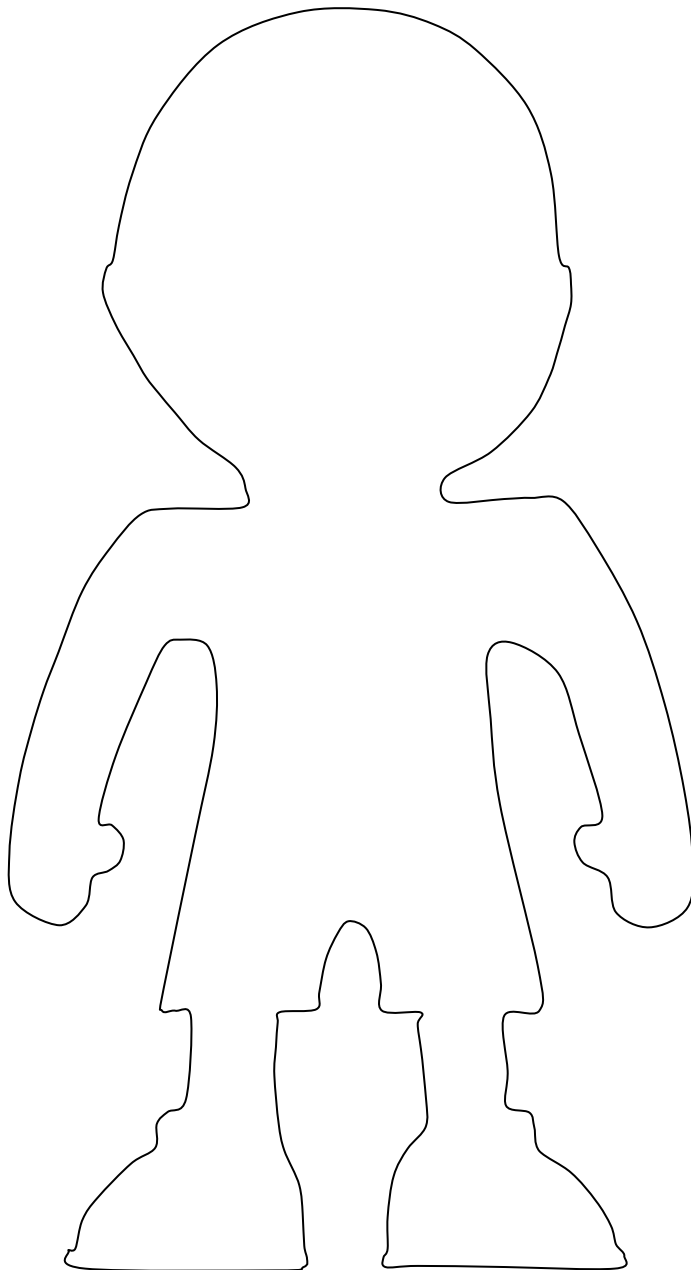
The FAD family was designed by a team from Walla Walla District's Lower Granite Natural Resource Office. The goal of this design is to promote "water safety for the entire family".

We have successfully used it as tool for getting adults talking (and thinking) about water safety before they get out on the lake with their children. Our ranger and volunteer staff have received many positive comments.

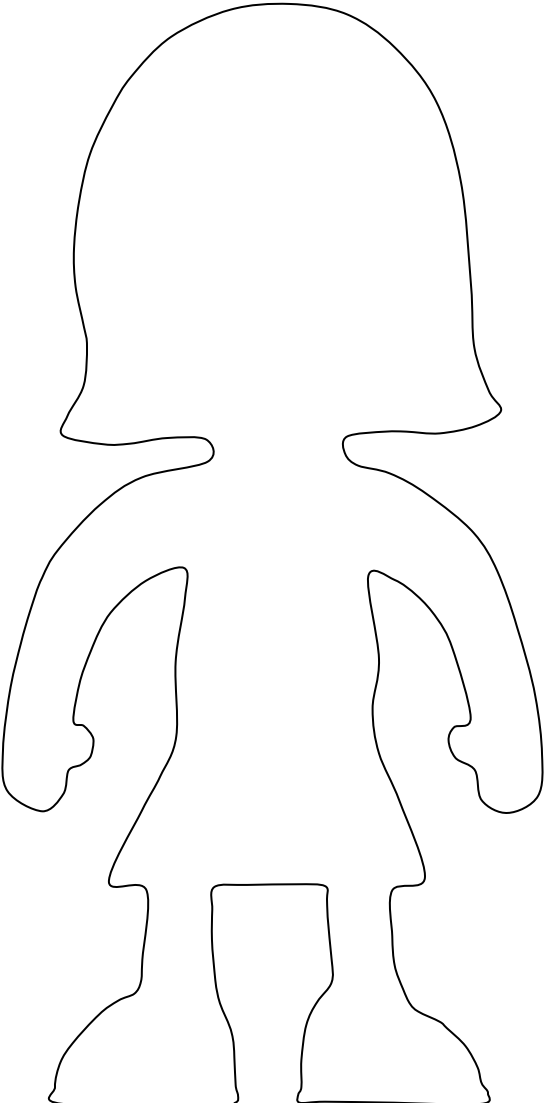

Stay tuned for our next design targeting sportsmen.

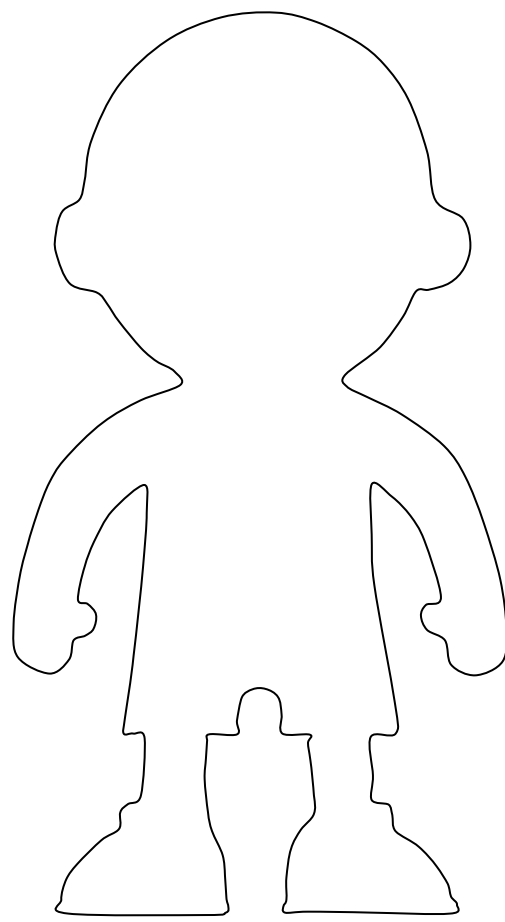

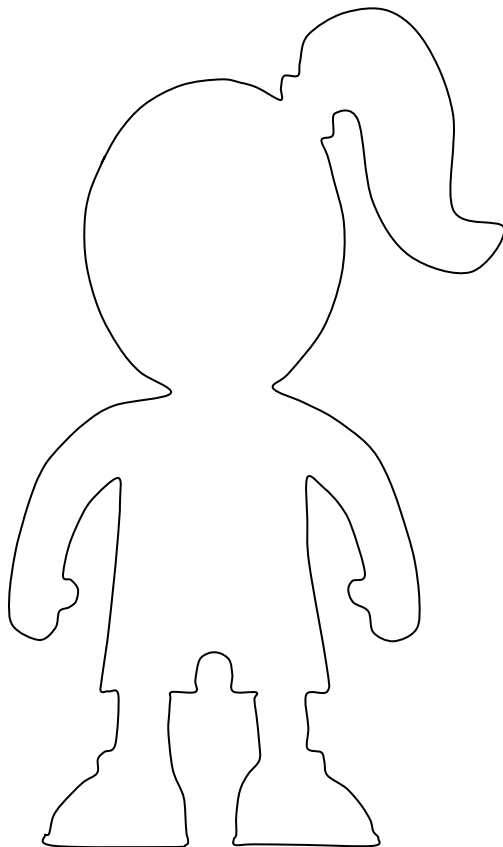

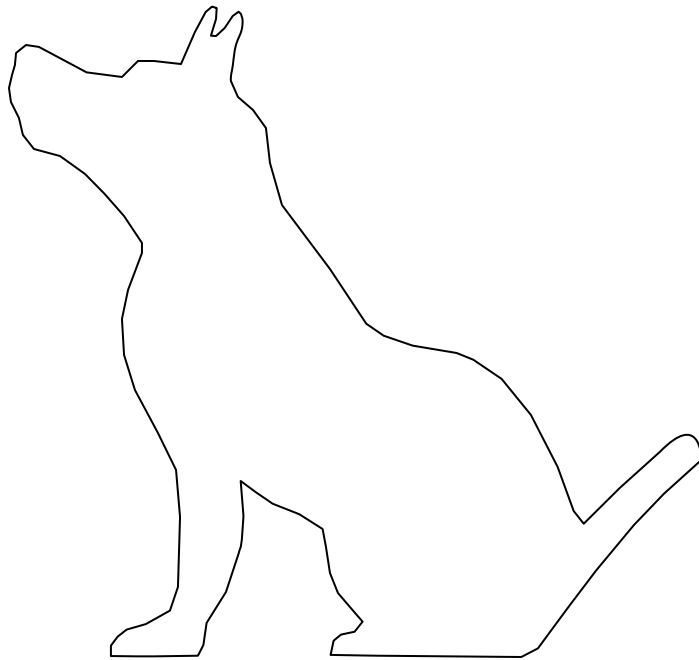
