DeGray Lake

Louisiana Field Office

Swim For Life is a program that guarantees every second grader in Caddo Parish receives instruction in swimming and water safety. Every week a group of 80-120 second graders come to the BHP YMCA 4 days in a row, and every day they do 30 minutes of in-water instruction and 30 minutes of classroom instruction. The in-water skills are bubble blowing, rescue bounce (hopping off the bottom of the pool for air), floating, swimming, and jump-push-turn-grab.

The classroom portion includes the big water rules like asking permission and never swimming alone, the dangers of natural bodies of water, how to identify and wear the right life jacket for you, and "Reach Throw Don't Go" (which includes a dry run on the gym floor, and then getting to actually use this technique to help get someone out of the pool. It's a lot of fun and very memorable)







ST. PAUL DISTRICT (MVP)

Mississippi Headwaters Project

Staff have been providing water safety programs for local schools, in which EKO passes are also disseminated. During the visits, a water safety video is shown, "Safe Passage", followed by discussion on the importance of wearing a life jacket. We were also able to include a water safety messaging/advertising has been added to a local lake association newsletter.

Eau Galle Recreation Area

Staff at Eau Galle Recreation area coordinated with the local newspaper to have a water safety message added – printed in color!





Staff have been attending local boat and travel sport shows to pass out water safety and Corps mission information, teaming up with local public affairs and lock and dam staff.

Lake Ashtabula/Baldhill Dam

Staff have been attending local boating, travel, and outdoor recreation sport shows to pass out water safety and Corps mission information. The low head dam model, lifejackets, other interactive presentations have been featured to engage attendees at the events.



St. Louis District attended their annual Park Ranger Training in Poplar Bluff, Missouri near Wappapello Lake.

Park Rangers use this training to network with other rangers in the St. Louis District, learn about upcoming program changes, project updates, complete annual refreshers, and discuss local issues and how to navigate them.

Park Ranger Tanner Canoy was awarded with the Star of Life Award. His fast reaction while patrolling saved a life at the Wappapello Lake Project.





The St. Louis District Water Safety Team
was awarded the Mississippi Valley
Division Water Safety Award for all their
water safety initiatives and efforts in
having zero drownings in FY23. This is the
first year there has been zero drownings in
the St. Louis District since the National
Water Safety Team has been recording
recreation fatalities.



Carlyle Lake

The groundwork for the yearly "I Got Caught" campaign commenced in March, rallying support from nearby businesses of the Carlyle Lake Project. This season, we've secured 35 partners who've joined hands in our efforts. As part of our collaboration, each partner will have their business name prominently featured on t-shirts to be distributed among summer visitors adhering to life jacket safety protocols.









Water safety messages were displayed on the digital reader board along Illinois Highway 27 and were also prominently featured on all bulletin boards designated for day-use activities resulting in a total of 104 static unique contacts for the quarter.



The Rend Lake ISOP team hosted the annual Holiday Celebration Small World Program from children ages 5 and younger. During the event, Bobber the Water Safety Dog shared Bobber activity books with all the participants while rangers reminded everyone to never play on icy lakes and ponds! 98 children and their family members attended.



The Rend Lake ISOP team participated in a career day at Sesser-Valier High School and shared the story of the "Many Hats of the Corps." The team emphasized the role of USACE Rangers in educating the public about water safety and facilitated water safety trivia.

Rivers Project Office

Clarksville Eagle Festival - In partnership with the City of Clarksville and in conjunction with Clarksville Eagle Days Rivers Project staff and volunteers hosted the USACE Eagle Education Day on 26 Jan. followed by a weekend of public tours at Lock and Dam #24 in Clarksville, MO. Seven regional schools totaling 250 4th grade students participated in the Eagle Education Day learning about the USACE mission including navigation, natural resource management, and water safety.



The public portion of the festival took place 27-28 Jan. wherein rangers provided dam tours and staffed an educational/information booth inside the festival hub which generated nearly 900 water safety contacts.



Ice Jam at the Dam - In partnership with Meeting of the Rivers Foundation, Mississippi River Water Trail Association, and several other local organizations the Rivers Project presented the third annual Ice Jam at the Dam at the National Great Rivers Museum. On 17 February over 600 visitors attended the family-focused event. Attractions included open tours of Melvin Price Locks and Dam, live animal presentations, live music, winter-themed educational booths, and visits from Bobber the Water Safety Dog accompanied by Louie, the St. Louis Blues Mascot. Open tours of Melvin Price brought visitors to the top of the structure to learn about the Navigational Channel and how it can change when the Mississippi River freezes over in the winter. Additionally, a special water safety-themed Polar Passport was granted to children who visited the 10 educational booths.

The NGRM welcomed 9,507 visitors throughout the winter of 2023-2024. The NGRM offers 3 public tours of the Melvin Price Locks and Dam daily that introduce visitors to the historical, cultural, economic, and ecological significance of the Mississippi River and features water safety messaging. During these tours, park rangers or dedicated NGRM volunteers engage visitors and share the Rivers Project's and USACE missions. The NGRM has engaged 1,330 individuals through tours of the Melvin Price Locks and Dam. The NGRM also organized special water safety games throughout the holiday season such 'Jon Hamm on the dam' a play on the 'Elf on the Shelf' holiday tradition. Visitors who successfully located the Jon Hamm figurine in a PFD were awarded a water safety prize.



Lake Shelbyville

Lake Shelbyville Environmental Stewardship teamed up with IDNR Fisheries, Lake Shelbyville Fish Habitat Alliance and the Lake Shelbyville Youth Ambassador Schools and built 75 catfish nesting boxes for channel catfish. The schools were provided the materials last fall. The students placed the boxes in various location in the lake the first part of March. Not only did the students learn about the fisheries at Lake Shelbyville they also learned the importance of Water Safety.







Unique water safety messages were added to the electronic reader board on Highway 16, in front of the Lake Shelbyville Visitor Center. These water safety messages focus on winter water safety and dangerous water temperatures.





On the first Friday of every month, Lake Shelbyville Park Ranger's join local news station WTIM to promote water safety messages and Lake Shelbyville updates.





Saylorville Lake

Saylorville Lake Area Recreation Guide - The new publication of the Saylorville Lake Area Recreation Guide is now out and available for the public. Inside the recreation guide is information about the lake and recreation areas in the vicinity. However, one of the most important things in the recreation guide is the water safety ad and information about life jacket loaner stations! Each year a water safety ad is included in the guide to promote water safety, not only at Saylorville Lake but around the area as well. The article about life jacket loaner stations provides information about the loaner stations, where to find them, and how they benefit the public.







Iowa Wild Hockey Game - On January 24th Park Rangers and volunteers attended an Iowa Wild hockey game at Wells Fargo Arena in Downtown Des Moines. This provided an opportunity for rangers to promote water safety with a table in the concourse area for spectators. Water safety information and promotional items were given away at the event. Around 150 water safety contacts were made.



Mississippi River Project

On December 8, Bobber attended a Quad City Storm hockey game along with other local area mascots. Bobber greeted fans, played a mascot hockey game against kids and even got to ride the Zamboni. Park Rangers escorting Bobber handed out water safety giveaways to fans as well.





The Corps staffed a booth at the Hunting, Fishing and Outdoor Show in Rock Island, IL on February 15-18. During the show, water safety giveaways were handed out along with river charts. Upcoming boating safety classes were promoted, and America the Beautiful Recreation Passes were issued. 1,491 people stopped by the booth during the event.

The Corps staffed a booth at Quad Cities Bald Eagle Days where water safety giveaways were handed out. Participants that stopped by the booth also had the opportunity to color a feather to be added to the displayed eagle. The weekend event started on January 5th with a school event during the day. The public event opened in the evening and ran through January 7th. 3,432 people stopped by the booth during the event.







Lake Red Rock Project

During a weekly safety meeting for staff, the video Cold Water Boot Camp was shown to review the dangers of cold-water immersion and ways to increase chances of survival. One of the biggest tactics involves wearing a life jacket. While viewing the video was a review for most of the staff, the information is timely as lake/river temperatures have dipped.





Ranger staff created a scavenger hunt for the visitor center to encourage youngsters to explore the facility. One task on the hunt includes searching for several small graphics of Bobber the Water Safety Dog that are hidden throughout the building. Hunters receive a Junior Ranger sticker as a reward for their efforts.





Interpretive staff utilized Bobber the Water Safety Dog coloring book graphics to create a temporary display in the Red Rock Visitor Center highlighting the Reach, Throw, Row, Don't Go message. Visitors are encouraged to try their luck with the Throw Ring Challenge – using a "Throw Ring" (water safety flier) to hook an orange cone by the display.
