St. Lucie Visitor Center - Okeechobee Waterway

Ranger James Norris, Ranger Robert Wiggins, and volunteers represented the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) at the 50th Annual Stuart Boat Show. By participating in this 3-day event on January 12-14, 2024 rangers and volunteers were able to share water safety messages, develop professional and community relationships, and inform the general public of the work that the USACE park rangers conduct on the Okeechobee waterway. 783 water safety contacts were made at this event by rangers and volunteers speaking with the public.









W.P. Franklin Visitor Center - Okeechobee Waterway

On Saturday, February 24th, Park Rangers Megan Parsons, Robert Hill, Jorge Leyro-Montalvo, and 8 USACE volunteers participated in the 2024 Labelle Swamp Cabbage Festival parade in Labelle, FL. This event is one of the biggest of the winter season, as this parade draws an estimated 15,000 attendees. During this event, rangers and volunteers promoted water safety by wearing their life jackets with Bobber the Water Safety Dog while on board their trailered ranger patrol boat. Rangers and volunteers who walked, made approximately 1,500 contacts by giving out water safety swag and Junior ranger badges. The parade announcers helped us spread our water safety message by reminding the public to "always wear their life jackets!"





On Saturday, March 9th, Park Rangers Megan Parsons and Rob Hill participated in the Annual Plant Sale & Strawberry Festival in Alva, FL. This event was hosted by one of our partners, the Alva Garden Club. At this event, Parsons and Hill not only promoted water safety, but spoke about Florida native and invasive plant species and handed out educational materials for the public. A total of 275 water safety contacts were made during this event.





W.P. Franklin Visitor Center - Okeechobee Waterway


On Saturday, March 16th, Park Rangers Megan Parsons, Jorge Leyro-Montalvo, Preston Heaton and USACE volunteers, participated in the 2024 Clewiston Sugar Festival in Clewiston, FL. This festival is always the largest of our winter outreach events. Volunteers and Rangers set up a water safety table, as well as the Interpretive Trailer which teaches about the history of the Okeechobee Waterway and the Corps missions. Nearly 2,000 water safety contacts were made.









He made 120 water safety contacts by discussing safe habits around water and reading "Water Watcher" The Importance on Wearing a Life Jacket. He also enjoyed reading "Green Eggs and Ham" to the students in honor of Dr. Seuss.







West Point Project Park Ranger Mike Linville joined Park Rangers Josh Davis and Mason Whitlock, from Walter F. George, to attend a career fair hosted by the Auburn University, College of Forestry, Wildlife and Environment on 07 Feb 24, in Auburn, Alabama. The team made approximately 35 contacts and received several resumes at the fair.

The water safety word was spread through 3 career fairs held in the month of February this year (Clay County Middle School, Auburn University, and the Worlds of Work fair in Dothan, AL). Attending the Clay County Middle School was Rangers Shannon Schaefer and Jason Kelly, Walter F. George Lake (WFG) and Lake Seminole with 80 contacts. The Auburn University career fair booth was operated by Rangers Joshua Davis and Mike Linville, WFG and West Point Lake with 35 contacts made. Lastly, the Worlds of Work fair in Dothan, AL was operated solely by WFGs Rangers Shannon Schaefer, Anthony Strickland, Evan Boatwright, and Mallory Brown with a total of 461 contacts made at that 2-day event. With any luck we will have our next Ranger out there spreading the water safety word!





On March 7, 2024, approximately 20 2nd grade students were taught water safety poolside at the Eufaula Community Center. The 2nd graders learned how to properly fit a PFD, water safety tips, and basic drown victim rescue tactics for their age group. Every year the local 2nd grade students get to participate in swimming lessons at the community center, and the Corps of Engineers' Ranger Shannon Schaefer is there to pass the safety word along!




Walter F. George Reservoir






John H. Kerr Dam & Reservoir


On 23-25 February 2024, W. Kerr Scott Park Rangers Johnny Jones and Grace Trimble along with John H. Kerr Park Ranger William Daniel and Conservation Biologist Alec Mitchell attended the annual Fishing Expo in Greensboro, NC where they operated a water safety booth. A total of 1483 visitors stopped by the booth to inquire about recreational opportunities at Corps lakes in the Wilmington District including boating, camping, and swimming and to obtain brochures and water safety material.

On Friday, March 22nd Park Rangers Emily Jones, Grace Trimble, and Elaine Wittry participated in Creech Road Elementary School's Science Day. Rangers Jones, Trimble, and Wittry facilitated a Critter Cardio program where over 80 students and their teachers participated. The kindergarteners learned about adaptations that native wildlife must use to survive via activities focused on getting the students moving. A water safety message and giveaways items were given to each student in attendance.

On Saturday March 23rd, regional award winners at the elementary, middle, and high school levels participated at the state level fair held at NC State University. As part of the day, students and their families had the opportunity to visit booths setup by various organizations promoting STEM education. Rangers Emily Jones, John H. Kerr, Elaine Wittry, B. Everett Jordan, Carmen Boyette, District NRM Section, and Michael Hosey, District NRM Section spent the day talking with families about the Corps, wildlife, and water safety. A bonus was the opportunity to talk with the students about their projects and what they wanted to be when they grew up.

Q1 Water Safety Award Scott DeMore, Hartwell Dam & Lake

Park Ranger Scott DeMore was nominated in recognition of his proactive efforts to spread the water safety message around and beyond Corpsmanaged areas at Hartwell Lake. He collaborated with local and state agencies, and business owners to display "Life Jackets Worn...Nobody Mourns" vinyl banners at 15 new locations across Anderson and Oconee Counties, the City of Clemson, Tugaloo State Park and Lake Keowee. Ranger DeMore's outreach efforts significantly enhanced Hartwell's water safety program by engaging user groups not typically reached by U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Park Rangers.
