

Canyon Lake - Community Emergency Program

On Saturday, the 25th of March 2023, Ranger Samuell Price presented on Water Safety at a Community Emergency preparedness Fail in Cibolo Texas. Many of the people living in the community use Canyon Lake on a regular basis. A water safety booth was set up for guests to come by and ask questions as well as play a game to learn water safety. The event lasted from 10 am to 1pm and members of several others including local EMS, firefighters, police officers, local HAM radio clubs and more also participated. Approximately 200 guests came through the event. Ranger Price was able to have direct conversations and teach water safety to 80 event participants that had further questions and

Canyon Lake - STEM & Water Safety Interp Program

Ranger Samuell Price presented on Thursday, the 23rd of March 2023 at Mountain Valley Middle School near Canyon lake Texas. The presentation was to the entire 7th grade level science class which has recently been discussing environmental impacts from flood events and what they can do to the environment. The teacher asked Ranger Price to come out and present on the topic by relating it back to the local Canyon Dam. A STEM lesson on dams and how they protect the people, and how they can have an affect on the environment and economy of a region was provided. Ranger Price followed up with a presentation on water safety which included a demonstration using students and showing them how to use a throw bag. Q&A was part of the interpretive. A total of 281 received the water safety and STEM lesson. This included 2 teachers and 279 students.




Lavon Lake - Life Jacket Loaner Stations

Lavon Lake has partnered with Safe Kids of North Texas, which is led by Cook Children's, to provide education and loaner life jackets for children and adults to be safer around the water. Over the past several weeks, the Lavon Lake staff and volunteers installed 5 Life Jacket loaner stations in day use areas at East fork, Avalon, Mallard, Ticky Creek and Little Ridge Parks. These life jacket loaner stations are printed in both English and Spanish. Safe Kids North Texas has agreed to supply additional life jackets if the current supplies become damaged, over-utilized, or are lost. Both Cook Children's and Lavon Lake are optimistic that these life jacket loaner stations will encourage safe water habits and prevent a terrible accident.

Little Rock Marine Expo and Big Buck Classic

Rangers from Little Rock and Vicksburg Districts participated in the Little Rock Marine Expo and Big Buck Classic. These even ts targeted outdoor enthusiasts and allowed staff to educate the public on the importance of life jacket wear while recreating on or near water. Rangers made contact with over 13,000 visitors by engaging each in water safety while distributing promotional items.

This three day event included a multitude of vendors associated

with lake recreation and multiple public water and boating safety organizations such as the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, Missouri State Water Patrol, and Sea Tow. Corps park rangers focused on promoting the use of life jackets and how to pick the appropriate type and fit. In addition to making numerous water safety contacts, Table Rock Lake Water Safety Coordinator, Ranger Angela Stone, created a partnership contact with Sea Tow Captain Jim Pulley at Table Rock Lake to donate to the Corps large numbers of life jackets to stock 15 Corps Life Jacket Loaner located around Table Rock Lake this spring.

Table Rock Lake Park Rangers Ryan Braaten, Matt Robbins , Angela Stone, and Seth Talbert staffed the Corps booth and made 475 direct water safety contacts.


Fort Gibson Lake - Oklahoma Tackle, Hunting and Boating Show in Pryor, OK
