

**AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
THE STUDENT CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION, INC.  
AND  
OUR LANDS & WATERS FOUNDATION**

This Agreement is made by and between The Student Conservation Association, Inc., a New York non-profit corporation with its principal place of business at 4245 North Fairfax Drive Arlington, VA 22203, ("SCA"), and Our Lands & Waters Foundation, a non-profit organization with offices at 1801 N. Mill Street, Suite B, Lewisville, Texas 75057 ("OLWF"), who collectively may be referred to as the "Parties".

Whereas, Our Lands & Waters Foundation is a leading non-profit organization working in partnership with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (US ACE) to realize the full potential of Corps managed parks as a natural resource to be preserved, enhanced and enjoyed by many members of the public. Our Lands & Waters Foundation, with its members as well as organizations that share its goals, works in a cooperative manner with the Corps of Engineers to bring needed services and to preserve, protect, and enhance lakes and parks. In addition, the Foundation works to raise the level of public awareness of the lakes and parks and to increase park attendance.

Whereas, The Student Conservation Association is the leading and largest youth conservation service program in the United States and has, since 1957, strived to build the next generation of conservation leaders while inspiring lifelong stewardship of the environment by engaging young people in hands-on service to the land, through programs embodying teamwork, community service and volunteerism. SCA is a non-advocacy organization offering many opportunities for education, leadership and personal development to youth and young adults, while providing a high quality public service in natural resource management and conservation for partner agencies, through its training and service programs including the Conservation Intern program.

Whereas, both parties wish to collaborate toward present and future sponsorship opportunities for Our Lands & Waters Foundation to support SCA's mission of enhancing natural resources while providing diverse young people with opportunities for hands-on service and career training opportunities, while benefitting the preservation and public use and enjoyment of US ACE lands and waters.

Whereas the US ACE Sam Rayburn Lake has requested two SCA Conservation Interns to serve as Water Safety Recreation Interns during summer 2013, and OLWF wishes to provide sponsorship support for SCA's conservation service mission including the two 2013 Sam Rayburn Lake Interns;

Now therefore, in consideration of the above premises, the parties hereto agree as follows:

**A. SCA Conservation Service Programs**

1. SCA will carry out its mission of providing young people with conservation service opportunities to benefit public lands, including providing Conservation Intern candidates for selection by US ACE Sam Rayburn Lake to serve 12-week internships as Water Safety Recreation Interns, carrying out the following activities:

Water Safety Recreation Interns will serve under Sam Rayburn Lake Corps of Engineer park rangers, with the primary goal of promoting water safety at Sam Rayburn Lake, the largest lake in Texas. Duties may include promoting water safety at boat launches,

providing courtesy vessel safety checks, assist with Corps boat patrols, presenting interpretive programs in campgrounds, and assisting with trail maintenance, opening and closing recreation areas, collecting comment cards, traffic counter information, and assisting with volunteer management. The Interns shall each serve a twelve-week term of service beginning on or after June 17 2013. ("Project")

To carry out this Project SCA will:

- a. Recruit, appoint, and place qualified candidates and assign these Conservation Interns as requested by the Sam Rayburn Lake for the Project.
- b. Administer the Conservation Interns' living allowance and provide general off-site administrative support, including securing and administering interns' rental housing, providing round trip travel grants to and from the site, uniforms, and other administrative and program support.
- c. Obtain and maintain all appointment and administrative records for the Conservation Interns sponsored under this Agreement.
- d. Provide an AmeriCorps Educational Award to qualifying Conservation Interns but only if and when made available by the Corporation for National and Community Service.

#### **B. Sponsorship Support**

1. OLWF will provide SCA a sponsorship payment of \$17,500 (Seventeen Thousand Five Hundred Dollars) to support SCA's conservation service mission (including all costs associated with the summer 2013 Sam Rayburn Lake internship Project). OLWF shall provide this sponsorship payment in full to SCA within 30 days of execution of this agreement.

#### **C. Sponsorship Promotion**

1. SCA will promote and/or recognize OLWF as a Corporate Sponsor, which may include press releases as mutually agreed by both parties, and a link and prominent visibility on sections of the SCA website.
2. SCA and OLWF will collaborate on potential future sponsorship initiatives to broaden the positive impact of this partnership, to further SCA's conservation service mission while promoting the broader preservation, public use and awareness of US ACE natural resources.

**D. Terms and Conditions.** It is mutually agreed by both parties that this agreement is contingent upon the following terms and conditions:

1. The SCA Conservation Interns will be under the direct daily oversight of the US ACE Sam Rayburn Lake project coordinator and staff.
2. The Conservation Interns will sign a US ACE Volunteer Services Agreement upon reporting for service. The Conservation Interns are volunteers under oversight of US ACE, and shall receive federal US ACE Workers Compensation coverage and Tort Liability coverage in accordance with the US ACE Volunteer Services Agreement and with all terms and conditions of the SCA-US ACE National Cooperative Agreement No. No.W81XWH-07-2-0088.




