4. Partnership data helps build internal support for our programs all the way up the line.

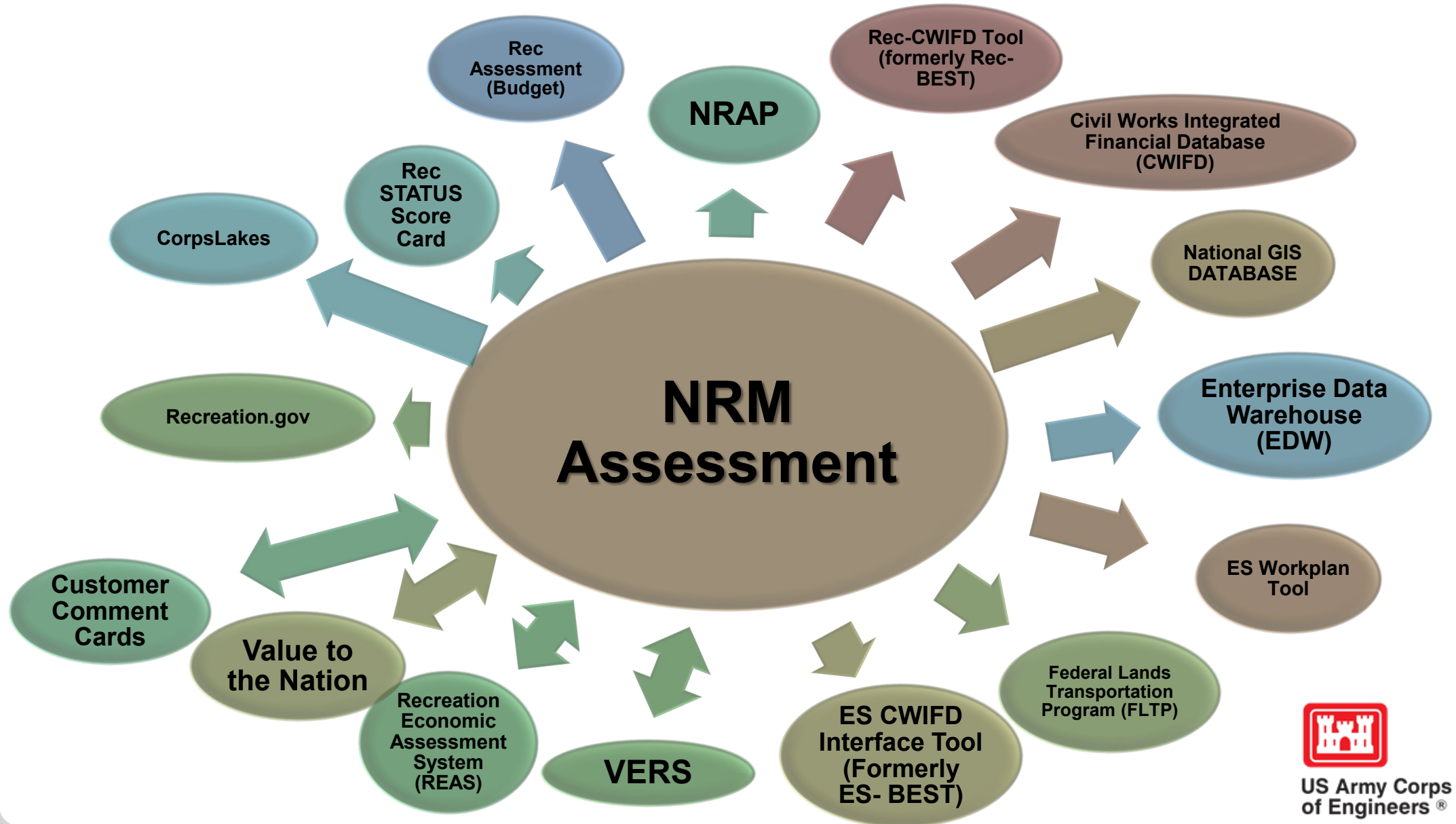

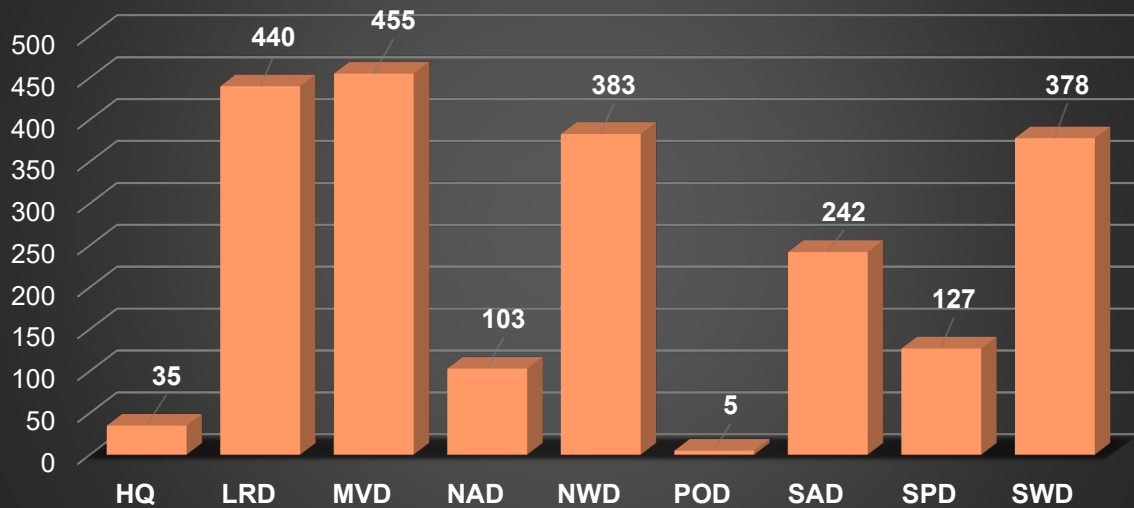

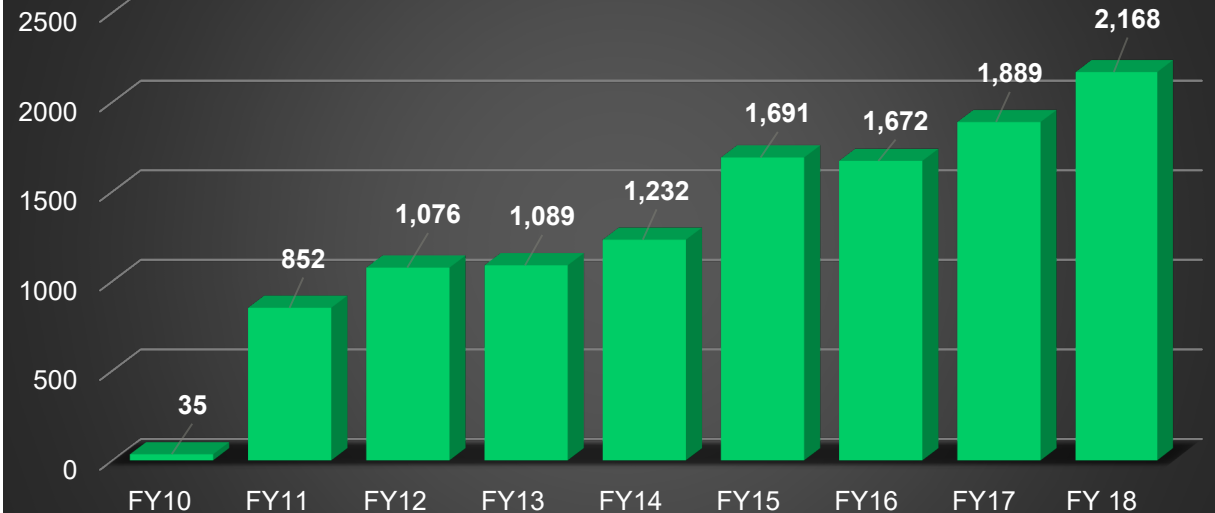

Partnerships in NRM Assessment/OMBIL

The NRM Assessment Tool and Operations and Maintenance Business Information Link (OMBIL) were developed to provide a location for data required to operate and manage the Operations function of the Corps. The NRM Assessment Tool contains 4 modules: Recreation PSA, NRM, Environmental Stewardship, and Partnerships were data is entered each year. OMBIL is the system used to run reports, and contains modules for each business function, which currently include Navigation, Hydropower, Recreation, Environmental Stewardship, Environmental Compliance, Flood Risk Management, Water Supply, and Safety & Occupational Health.

The Partnerships pages in OMBIL are located under the Recreation and Environment Stewardship Business Functions reports screen. Reports are listed in the drop-down menus under "COMMON – Partnership Detail Report, REC- Partnership Detail Report or REC-Partnership Summary Report, ES – Partnership Detail Report or ES – Partnerships Summary Report." (No password or special permissions required).

Annual fiscal data entry for the NRM Assessment Partnership pages opens each year October 1 - October 31 to enter the value of each partnership for the prior fiscal year.

Note: Partnership data entry involves a two-step process. Step 1: Enter information about the partnership, including agreement type, organization, organization type, date effective, description. Step 2: Enter information about the value of the partnership, including number of volunteers, volunteer hours, partner funds invested, professional services provided, materials and equipment donated, Corps contract funds, services, materials and equipment, and additional investments.

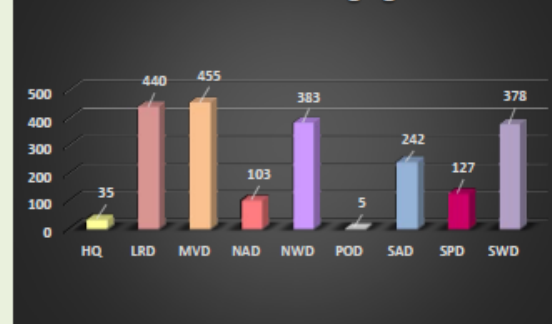

*Data from NRM Assessment

The Corps of Engineers' natural resource management mission is to manage and conserve natural resources, consistent with ecosystem management principles, while providing quality public outdoor recreation experiences to serve the needs of present and future generations. The challenges facing this mission require a new way of doing business, by increasing community engagement and collaboration to ensure we meet the needs of the public. Our partners and volunteers are organizations and people who want to give back to their communities and are interested in being involved in the Corps natural resource management program. Whether it is an environmental ethic, a love of parks, or enthusiasm for the outdoors, like-minded partners and volunteers share their expertise, resources, time and energy to work together toward common goals.

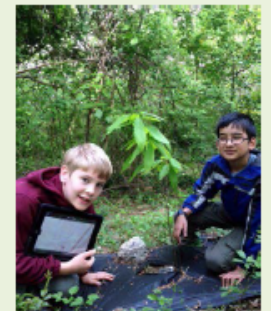

We strive to match our partners and volunteers' talents and interests with work to be done, in order to achieve our shared vision. While partners and volunteers are not a substitute for Corps management of the federal resources, they help accomplish programs and activities for which funding is not available and therefore would not normally be performed. In FY 2018, 43% of our partnerships were for environmental stewardship projects, and 57% were for recreation projects.

- **Boy/Girl Scouts:** 3,323 scouts from 88 troops were able to complete eagle scout projects, learn new outdoor skills, beautify parks through shoreline cleanups, raise funds by recycling, perform service projects, earn badges, and participate in educational programs by park rangers to learn about natural resource careers.
- **Cooperating associations:** 52 nonprofit associations held special events, operated bookstores, fundraised, provided interpretive programs, and served as community advocates for the Corps.
- **CVBs, businesses, community organizations:** More than 800 businesses and community organizations partnered with the Corps to offer recreation-related services and supplies to visitors while also

Partnerships in NRM – Common Errors

Special events

Many people forget that the contributions provided by partners is considered a partnership and has value.

Be sure to enter the partner info for Kids to Parks Day, National Public Lands Day, FLW fishing events, CAST fishing events, Get Outdoors Day, Bass Pro special events, etc.

The partner value should include the value of their time, and supplies they provide for the event (this can be booth space or marketing materials).

Entering National Public Lands Day (NPLD) Events

- 1) Enter volunteer data into the NRM Module of NRM Assessment Tool
- 2) Enter the event into the Partnerships module of NRM Assessment
 - a) If other partners are involved, list National Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF) as the primary partner and all others as co-partners
 - b) If no other partners are participating in the event, just list NEEF as the primary partner
 - c) Partner contribution should be the volunteer hours performed within the scope of the event.

National MOUs

If a partner is on the list of national MOUs and there is not some other agreement type involved in the project, make sure to select MOU. Many lakes also have local MOUs.

Cooperating Association

There is a pick-list for these associations. If you have an official association that is not on the list, let me know and I will get it added.

Every one of these organizations should have some type of value associated with them for the year.

Partnerships in NRM Assessment – Common Errors

Contributions

Volunteer service value for individuals should not be included in the partnership section of NRM Assessment, unless they have also contributed funds, material/ supplies.

Volunteers that work as part of an organization can be included here along with the value of funds, services, and materials contributed.

Entering Volunteer Hours Correctly

What NRM Assessment **DOESN'T** auto calculate:

- Total number of volunteer hours worked
 - Enter the **TOTAL HOURS**, not hours per volunteer
 - If you have 5 volunteers that worked 3 hours each, total volunteer hours should be 15 (not 3)

What NRM Assessment **DOES** auto calculate:

- Value of volunteer service
 - Automatically multiplies the total number of hours times the annual “value of volunteer service” set forth by the independent sector.

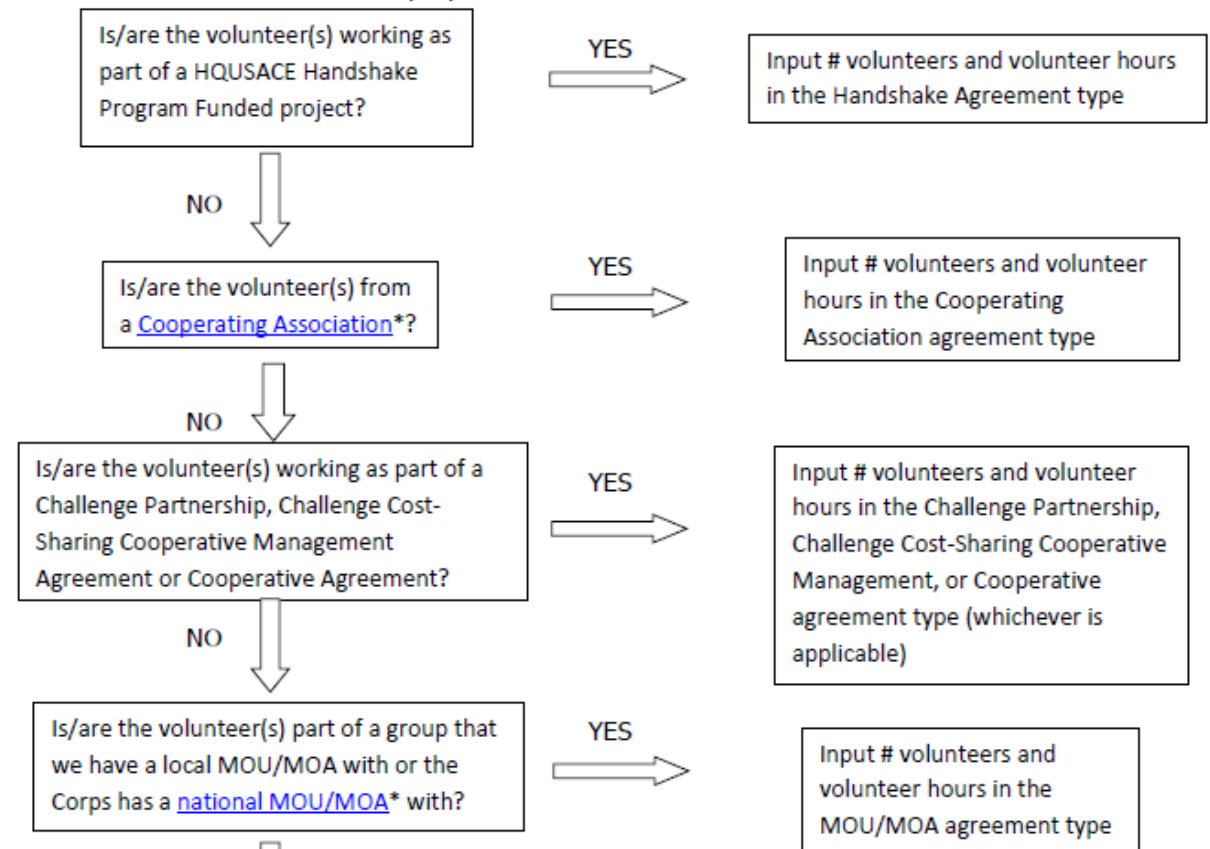

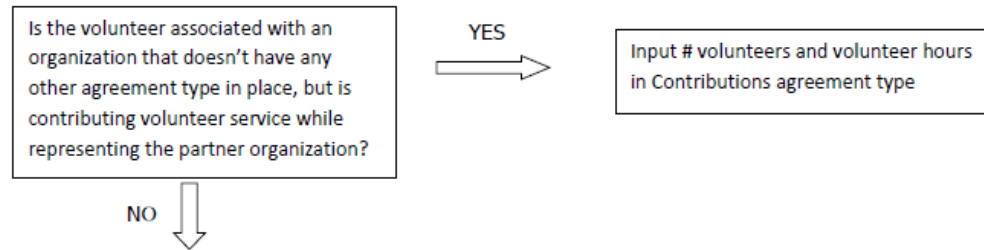
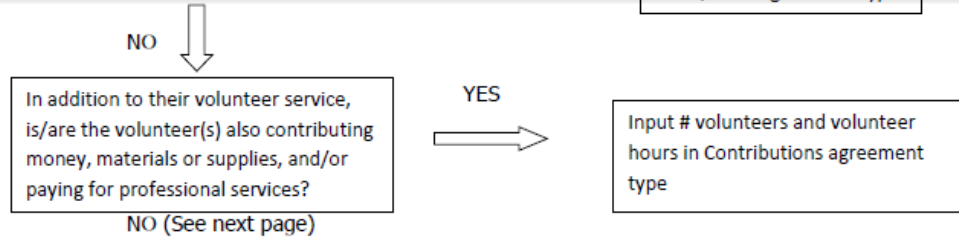
Enter ALL volunteer hours in this section of the NRM Assessment Tool. This is where you will capture the total number of volunteers, total hours of volunteer service (which will auto-calculate the total value of the service), and total incidental expenses reimbursed to all volunteers for the FY.

Step 2. NRM Assessment Tool Partnership Module

In addition to gathering information about the overall number of volunteers, hours, and value, we are also trying to capture more detailed data about volunteers that are part of a partnership. Some volunteers such as camp hosts, gate attendants, and other individuals who volunteer may only be counted in the NRM Module update. Other volunteers that are part of a partner organization should also have their hours counted in the Partnership Module update.

Please use the flow chart below to determine whether to count a particular individual volunteer's or group of volunteers' hours in the Partnership Update section of OMBIL.





If you answer No to all of the questions above, the data for these volunteers will ONLY be input in the NRM Module Update section of NRM Assessment, not under the Partnerships Module. If you answer Yes to any of the questions above, input the data into the first category with a Yes answer starting from the top down. Some volunteers may fit into multiple categories, but you should input the data in the first applicable category encountered in the flow chart.

Example 1: A volunteer group from IMBA (International Mountain Biking Association) may provide service to the Corps as part of a Challenge Partnerships Agreement, but they are also part of a national MOU. Because the Challenge Partnership agreement is an agreement for a limited, specific period of time and project, the volunteer hours for the particular project in the agreement should be input in the Challenge Partnership category instead of the MOU. If IMBA also volunteers hours not related to the Challenge Partnership Agreement, those additional hours would be input separately in the MOU category.

Example 2: Volunteers from a Cooperating Association, such as the Friends of Raystown Lake provide services for a project that is part of a Handshake Agreement. These hours should be input in the Handshake category instead of the Cooperating Association category, because the Handshake agreement is for a specific project. Additional hours volunteered by Association members such as working in a bookstore, creating interpretive materials, or managing a campground should be captured in the Cooperating Association category if they are not specifically associated with the Handshake project.

Tracking Materials Costs

Make sure that materials costs are included in your partnership data.

- If a Boy Scout Troop comes to work on your project and they bring their own gloves, include the cost of gloves in their contribution.
- If a project vehicle is used to move materials to volunteer sites around the project, include an estimate for vehicle cost to your materials provided to the partnership.

Handshake

This partnership type should only be selected for those projects that have received handshake funds from HQUSACE in the past 3 fiscal years.

Once the handshake funded project is complete, if you still work with the partner in future years, you'll need to make that a new partnership type to reflect the work (i.e. contribution, MOU, challenge partnership as applicable)

Zero values

All of the prior year partners are automatically loaded in to the system.

If a particular partner did not do anything with the project this year, it needs to be marked as No Activity.

Do not put zeros in every data field if the partner was not active.

Corps Value

We need to continue focusing on getting the Corps value entered in addition to the partner value.

There is always going to be a value of an employee's time that should be captured in the Services column.

We are also missing out on a lot of materials/ equipment value that we bring to these partnerships.

NRM Assessment Tool

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, the NRM community (Recreation and Environmental Stewardship Business Lines) will be utilizing the NRM-Assessment Tool (formerly the Rec-Assessment Tool) to collect annual data that will then be uploaded into OMBIL. Several notices, webinars and coordination have occurred through the OMBIL users group and District POC's.

OMBIL will remain the primary database of record for all O&M business line data and, as such, it is imperative that the data be kept current. OMBIL data is used for many different purposes, including decisions concerning facility development, budget development and defense, tracking performance measures, preparation of briefings and fact sheets, asset management, etc. It is used to populate information on the Gateway and numerous other internal and external web sites. OMBIL will continue to serve as source for many other systems including CWIFD, EDW and VERS. Inaccurate and/or incomplete data not only reflects poorly on the Corps and renders a disservice to the public, but could also jeopardize the viability of our O&M missions and budget defense.

This transition to a new platform is a gained efficiency for one-stop data entry rather than input into several systems as had been the standard in the past. The NRM-Assessment tool will serve as the data collection platform necessary to feed OMBIL the appropriate data. This process is more in line with other business lines that import data such as hydropower and navigation while allowing the NRM business line more flexibility and less OMBIL contractor work. Training through web meetings will be provided to the field on the data entry process as and will be announced through the OMBIL District POCs. The schedule for entering data by modules is as follows.

- Recreation PSA Module - Includes: PSA Information and Facilities
PSA Module Opens 1 April and Close 31 May
- NRM Modules - Includes: Interpretive Contacts, Special Events, Law Enforcement Contracts, and Annual Project Data Modules Open 1 September and Close 15 October
- Environmental Stewardship Modules - Includes: Shoreline Management, Boundaries/Encroachments, Soils/Vegetation/Wetlands Classification, Pollinators, Fire Management, Invasive Species, Fish/Land Mitigation, and Master Plans
Modules Open 1 September and Close 15 October

Module Open 1 September and Close 15 October

- Handshake Partnerships** - These are agreements entered into for the purpose of receiving these funds. HQ will review all agreements before they are entered into. If you have any questions, please contact the District partnership program coordinator.
- Challenge Partnerships** - The Corps can enter into agreements to accept funds, materials and services from non-federal public and private entities to provide for operation and/or management and development of recreation facilities and natural resources, where such facilities are being maintained at full federal expense. The partners contributed resources are combined with regular project resources to accomplish work within current authorities and contained in the annual or five-year work plan in the approved operational management plan. Work is generally accomplished during one fiscal year. (33 U.S.C. §2328; EP 1130-2-500, [Chapter 12](#); ER 1130-2-500, [Chapter 12](#)).
- Challenge Cost Sharing Cooperative Management Agreements** - Corps facilities may be operated in collaboration with eligible non-Federal public entities through a Challenge Cost Sharing Cooperative Management (CCSCM) Agreement and Partner Operations Plan. Agreements may be entered into with non-Federal entities for the purposes of cooperatively managing public recreation areas, and fees may be collected and retained by the partner for reinvestment at the site at which the fees are collected.
- Cooperating Associations** - A legal entity, organized under state law, with a non-profit and tax-exempt status under Internal Revenue Service codes and which operate under the terms of a Cooperating Association Agreement with the Corps of Engineers. They are free-standing corporate entities with boards of directors, purposes, and abilities consistent with their boards and objectives. Some associations work in single areas; others are involved in various areas achieving multiple tasks.
- Cooperative Agreement** - A legal instrument reflecting a relationship between the Corps and a State, local government, or other recipient where a thing of value is transferred to carry out a public purpose AND substantial involvement occurs between all the entities or partners. A Cooperative Agreement provides a means to pay for assistance with a non-Federal partner. To implement this type of Cooperative Agreement, a specific statute or authority is necessary. These Cooperative Agreements follow the Department of Defense grant & Agreement Regulations (DoDGARS) (DOD 3210.6-R) and are generally administered through Contracting staff via a certified Grants Officer (Title 31, Subtitle V, Chapter 63, section 6305).
- Contributions Program** - The Corps is authorized to accept contributions of cash, funds, materials, and services from groups and individuals for operation and management of recreation facilities and protection and restoration of natural resources at civil works water resource projects. Contributions must be within current authorities, consistent within the Corps' mission, and for work items contained in an approved OMP. A contribution plan serves as the agreement for this program.
- Economy Act Partnerships** - Agreements for services and/or supplies with other federal agencies. Congress authorized government agencies to enter into agreements for goods and services when it is in the best interests of each agency and cost savings will result. This kind of agreement requires a determinations and findings approval form that documents verification and approval of legal authority for the agreement.

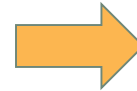

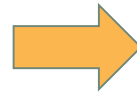

NRM Assessment Tool

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, the NRM community (Recreation and Environmental Stewardship Business Lines) will be utilizing the NRM-Assessment Tool (formerly the Rec-Assessment Tool) to collect annual data that will then be uploaded into OMBIL. Several notices, webinars and coordination have occurred through the OMBIL users group and District POC's.

OMBIL will remain the primary database of record for all O&M business line data and, as such, it is imperative that the data be kept current. OMBIL data is used for many different purposes, including decisions concerning facility development, budget development and defense, tracking performance measures, preparation of briefings and fact sheets, asset management, etc. It is used to populate information on the Gateway and numerous other internal and external web sites. OMBIL will continue to serve as source for many other systems including CWIFD, EDW and VERS. Inaccurate and/or incomplete data not only reflects poorly on the Corps and renders a disservice to the public, but could also jeopardize the viability of our O&M missions and budget defense.

This transition to a new platform is a gained efficiency for one-stop data entry rather than input into several systems as had been the standard in the past. The NRM-Assessment tool will serve as the data collection platform necessary to feed OMBIL the appropriate data. This process is more in line with other business lines that import data such as hydropower and navigation while allowing the NRM business line more flexibility and less OMBIL contractor work. Training through web meetings will be provided to the field on the data entry process as and will be announced through the OMBIL District POCs. The schedule for entering data by modules is as follows.

- Recreation PSA Module - Includes: PSA Information and Facilities
PSA Module Opens 1 April and Close 31 May
- NRM Modules - Includes: Interpretive Contacts, Special Events, Law Enforcement Contracts, and Annual Project Data Modules Open 1 September and Close 15 October
- Environmental Stewardship Modules - Includes: Shoreline Management, Boundaries/Encroachments, Soils/Vegetation/Wetlands Classification, Pollinators, Fire Management, Invasive Species, Fish/Land Mitigation, and Master Plans
Modules Open 1 September and Close 15 October
