

- MLF provides Corps with booth space and outreach opportunities at WalMart, High School, and College Fishing tournaments


















Every Kid Outdoors

Bonneville Explore the Corps - Teacher Workshop, OR (NWP)

WHO: USACE, Oregon Natural Resources Education Program (ONREP) and the National Wildlife Federation (NWF)

WHAT: 13 educators attended a 6-hour workshop presented by USACE and NWF

WHY: Provide teachers with Corps environmental education and STEM resources. The workshop qualified teachers to receive 6 hours of continuing education requirements.

Topics covered: Corps Speaker's Bureau program, special events (i.e. Engineering Day/Eagle Watch), field trip options for dam tours and visitor centers, Virtual Bonneville curriculum, water safety education, Jr. Ranger, Every Kid Outdoors and Fish Eggs to Fry programs.

SUMMARY

Thirteen teachers from the Portland Metro and surrounding area attended. The workshop qualified them to receive 6 hours of continuing education credentials. The Corps presented Partner Excellence Coins and Certificates of Appreciation, donated by the Corps Foundation, to ONREP and NWF in recognition of their time (~30 hours) helping to plan, coordinate and execute the event. Partner content added to our Virtual Bonneville website and Corps content added to ONREP/NWF website.



Philpott Lake Concerts by Canoe, NC (SAW)



- Sponsored by Franklin County Parks and Recreation with Philpott staff and USACE volunteer support
- Twin Ridge Recreation Area on Philpott Lake is the summer designation for concerts by canoe.
- Three concerts took place in 2021 summer season drawing crowds of more than 150 each time.
- Spectators could sit along the shoreline, paddle around the dock or boat in to watch local bands play live music on the dock.
- USACE set up a booth each time to deliver water safety message and interact with the public.





WHY: Engage new users, promote paddlecraft sports and public access



Summary: The Glow Paddle is a Halloween-themed haunted water trail for paddle-craft. Attendees are encouraged to come in costume and decorate and illuminate their craft. Paddlers are then guided along the trail with viewing stops of land-based spooky skits and décor. Safety boats and experienced guides assist paddlers on their journey. Upon completing the trail, attendees enjoy camaraderie around a campfire enjoying cider and smores.

- Bowie, Cass-Marion, and
