Partnerships in NRM Assessment/OMBIL

The NRM Assessment Tool and Operations and Maintenance Business Information Link (OMBIL) were developed to provide a location for data required to operate and manage the Operations function of the Corps. The NRM Assessment Tool contains 4 modules: Recreation PSA, NRM, Environmental Stewardship, and Partnerships were data is entered each year. OMBIL is the system used to run reports, and contains modules for each business function, which currently include Navigation, Hydropower, Recreation, Environmental Stewardship, Environmental Compliance, Flood Risk Management, Water Supply, and Safety & Occupational Health.

The Partnerships pages in OMBIL are located under the Recreation and Environment Stewardship Business Functions reports screen. Reports are listed in the drop-down menus under "COMMON – Partnership Detail Report, REC- Partnership Detail Report or REC-Partnership Summary Report, ES – Partnership Detail Report or ES – Partnerships Summary Report." (No password or special permissions required).

Annual fiscal data entry for the NRM Assessment Partnership pages opens each year October 1 - October 31 to enter the value of each partnership for the prior fiscal year.

Note: <u>Partnership data entry involves a two-step process</u>. Step 1: Enter information about the partnership, including agreement type, organization, organization type, date effective, description. Step 2: Enter information about the value of the partnership, including number of volunteers, volunteer hours, partner funds invested, professional services provided, materials and equipment donated, Corps contract funds, services, materials and equipment, and additional investments.

Volunteer Hours System

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has established a volunteer pass program which enables volunteers who have served a minimum of 100 hours at Corps managed areas to receive a waiver of all day use fees via an Annual Day Use Pass. The purpose of this program is to support and recognize volunteers who have served the Corps in an exemplary way and encourage their visitation and use of Corps parks. The main goal is to increase visitation to Corps parks by enticing volunteers to visit new places, bring friends and family, and continue to explore and enjoy Corps recreation opportunities even after their pass has expired.

Volunteer hours will be verified and entered by the volunteer coordinator into this centralized database. After serving 100 hours of service, the volunteer will be eligible to earn an Annual Day Use Pass from the local project where they reached their 100th hour. Only one Annual Day Use Pass may be earned per volunteer per year.

(NOTE: There is NOT a new Volunteer Pass that you print from this system. Once you "cash in" the 100+ hours for the volunteer, you will need to issue an Annual Day Use Pass from the passbooks kept at your project. In the \$ amount section of the receipt, write "Complimentary pass issued to Volunteer for 100+ hours served")

As of January 1, 2016 volunteers for the Corps of Engineers are eligible to earn and America the Beautiful Interagency Volunteer Pass for completing 250 cumulative hours of service at any of the participating federal land management agencies (USACE, NPS, BLM, FWS, USDA Forest Service, BLM). Hours should be tracked using this system.

NRM Assessment Tool

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2018, the NRM community (Recreation and Environmental Stewardship Business Lines) will be utilizing the NRM-Assessment Tool (formerly the Rec-Assessment Tool) to collect annual data that will then be uploaded into OMBIL. Several notices, webinars and coordination have occurred through the OMBIL users group and District POC's.

OMBIL will remain the primary database of record for all O&M business line data and, as such, it is imperative that the data be kept current. OMBIL data is used for many different purposes, including decisions concerning facility development, budget development and defense, tracking performance measures, preparation of briefings and fact sheets, asset management, etc. It is used to populate information on the Gateway and numerous other internal and external web sites. OMBIL will continue to serve as source for many other systems including CWIFD, EDW and VERS. Inaccurate and/or incomplete data not only reflects poorly on the Corps and renders a disservice to the public, but could also jeopardize the viability of our O&M missions and budget defense.

This transition to a new platform is a gained efficiency for one-stop data entry rather than input into several systems as had been the standard in the past. The NRM-Assessment tool will serve as the data collection platform necessary to feed OMBIL the appropriate data. This process is more in line with other business lines that import data such as hydropower and navigation while allowing the NRM business line more flexibility and less OMBIL contractor work. Training through web meetings will be provided to the field on the data entry process as and will be announced through the OMBIL District POCs. The schedule for entering data by modules is as follows.

- Recreation PSA Module Includes: PSA Information and Facilities Corrections submitted by 15 August 2021 - See PSA Module for more details
- NRM Modules Includes: Interpretive Contacts, Special Events, Law Enforcement Contracts, and Annual Project Data Modules Open 15 September and Close 31 October 2021
- Environmental Stewardship Modules Includes: Shoreline Management, Boundaries/Encroachments, Soils/Vegetation/Wetlands Classification, Pollinators, Fire Management, Invasive Species, Fish/Land Mitigation, and Master Plans Modules Open 15 September and Close 31 October 2021
- Partnerships Module Open 1 October and Close 14 November 2021

• Economy Act Partnerships - Agreements for services and/or supplies with other federal agencies. Congress authorized government agencies to enter into agreements for goods and services when it is in the best interests of each agency and cost savings will result. This kind of agreement requires a determinations and findings approval form that documents verification and approval of legal authority for the agreement.

Federal Grants - Choose this type specifically for Federal Highways grants, US Forest Service Pest Suppression grants, and any other grants directly received from another Federal agency.

• Memoranda of Understanding/Memorandum of Agreement (MOU/MOA) From time to time, the Corps enters into written agreements with federal, state and non-federal entities to promote water resources-related issues important to both parties or to coordinate Corps authorized activities with another party. These agreements do not exchange any funds and **do not obligate Corps funds but mainly reflect the desire to work together in a cooperative manner**. In addition, these agreements do not establish authority for the non-competitive award of any contract or other agreement. Responsibilities under such agreements are subject to the availability of funds.

Partnerships in NRM – Common Errors



Special events

Many people forget that the contributions provided by partners is considered a partnership and has value.

Be sure to enter the partner info for Kids to Parks Day, National Public Lands Day, FLW fishing events, CAST fishing events, Get Outdoors Day, Bass Pro special events, etc.

The partner value should include the value of their time, and supplies they provide for the event (this can be booth space or marketing materials).



Entering National Public Lands Day (NPLD) Events



- 1) Enter volunteer data into the NRM Module of NRM Assessment Tool
- 2) Enter the event into the Partnerships module of NRM Assessment
 - a) If other partners are involved, list National Environmental Education Foundation (NEEF) as the primary partner and all others as co-partners (Do not enter NPLD as the partner name.)
 - b) If no other partners are participating in the event, just list NEEF as the primary partner
 - c) Partner contribution should be the volunteer hours performed within the scope of the event.





National MOUs

If a partner is on the list of national MOUs and there is not some other agreement type involved in the project, make sure to select MOU. Many lakes also have local MOUs.





Cooperating Association

There is a pick-list for these associations. If you have an official association that is not on the list, let Heather Burke know and she will get it added.

Every one of these organizations should have some type of value associated with them for the year.





Contributions

Volunteer service value for individuals should not be included in the partnership section of NRM Assessment, unless they have also contributed funds, material/ supplies.

Volunteers that work as part of an organization can be included here along with the value of funds, services, and materials contributed.

Volunteers that serve in an outgranted area (leased or licensed area) should not be counted in NRM Assessment unless they are working directly for USACE in that area and signed up on a OF301a form.



Volunteer Reporting in NRM Assessment/OMBIL



- Volunteer data must be captured each year during October in the NRM Assessment tool
- Annual Project Data Update: Record total number of volunteers, volunteer hours, and reimbursed incidental expenses
- Annual Partnerships Update: Record number of volunteers and volunteer hours that the partner provides
- Hours served by SCA and other youth conservation corps groups should be entered as volunteer hours in both update sections.
- USACE and other federal agencies use the Independent Sector's hourly rate as set by the Bureau of Labor Statistics each spring to calculate the value of service per hour, regardless of age or activity. No cost of living or other adjustments of any kind may be made to this rate.

Step 1. NRM Assessment Tool NRM Module, Step 1- Volunteer Information

Enter ALL volunteer hours in this section of the NRM Assessment Tool. This is where you will capture the total number of volunteers, total hours of volunteer service (which will auto-calculate the total value of the service), and total incidental expenses reimbursed to all volunteers for the FY.

Step 2. NRM Assessment Tool Partnership Module

In addition to gathering information about the overall number of volunteers, hours, and value, we are also trying to capture more detailed data about volunteers that are part of a partnership. Some volunteers such as camp hosts, gate attendants, and other individuals who volunteer may only be counted in the NRM Module update. Other volunteers that are part of a partner organization should also have their hours counted in the Partnership Module update.

Please use the flow chart below to determine whether to count a particular individual volunteer's or group of volunteers' hours in the Partnership Update section of OMBIL.











Entering Volunteer Hours Correctly

What NRM Assessment **DOESN'T** auto calculate:

- Total number of volunteer hours worked
 - Enter the TOTAL HOURS, not hours per volunteer
 - If you have 5 volunteers that worked 3 hours each, total volunteer hours should be 15 (not 3)

What NRM Assessment **DOES** auto calculate:

- Value of volunteer service
 - Automatically multiplies the total number of hours times the annual "value of volunteer service" set forth by the independent sector.



Tracking Materials Costs



Make sure that materials costs are included in your partnership data.

- If a Boy Scout Troop comes to work on your project and they bring their own gloves, include the cost of gloves in their contribution.
- If a project vehicle is used to move materials to volunteer sites around the project, include an estimate for vehicle cost to your materials provided to the partnership.





Handshake (This is not the same thing as an informal partnership where you 'shake hands' with the partner.)

This partnership type should only be selected for those projects that have received handshake funds from HQUSACE in the past 3 fiscal years.

Once the handshake funded project is complete, if you still work with the partner in future years, you'll need to make that a new partnership type to reflect the work (i.e. contribution, MOU, challenge partnership as applicable)





Economy Act

This partnership type should only be used when USACE is paying for <u>another Federal agency's</u> services or vice versa. This involves the combination of an FS 7600a (formerly MOA/Interagency Agreement) and FS7600b to transfer funds.

For data purposes, when USACE is purchasing services from the other agency:

- The amount we pay the other federal agency (to provide their service to us), input in the Partner Professional Services Provided column.
- If they have used their own materials/equipment, include that in the Partner Materials/Equipment column
- Cost to route the Economy Act Agreement through Contracting (Grants Officer), input in the Corps Contract Costs column.
- Cost of Corps field staff time to work with the other federal agency implementing the project, input in Corps Labor.
- Cost of materials and supplies (if any) from the Corps, input in Materials/Equipment





Zero values

All of the prior year partners are automatically loaded into the system.

If a particular partner did not do anything with the project this year, it needs to be marked as No Activity.

Do not put zeros in every data field if the partner was not active.





Corps Labor Hours

We need to continue focusing on getting the Corps costs entered in addition to the partner value.

There is always going to an employee's time that should be captured in the Corps Labor Hours column.

We are also missing out on a lot of materials/ equipment value that we bring to these partnerships.

Enter CORPS HOURS instead of \$\$ of Corps Labor. The value will be auto calculated in the reports.



Data Field Definitions



- Value of sales (only for cooperating associations) total value of gross sales returned to the project in accordance with the agreement.
- Funds invested total dollar amount of cash funds invested by the partner (excluding bookstore sales funds reinvested in project)
- Professional services provided total \$ value of professional services (i.e. engineer donating time to draft up plans and specifications or a grant writer donating professional time to research and write a grant proposal, etc.) provided by the partner. Calculate the value by multiplying the number of hours served times the prevailing hourly service charge.
- Materials & equipment donated total \$ value of materials and equipment provided by the partner. Calculate the value of equipment using the local hourly/daily rental rate cost



Data Field Definitions



- HQ investment (only for Handshake) the total \$ value received from the Handshake Partnership money provided by HQUSACE
- Contract Costs- the total \$ value of services contracted by the Corps for use in conjunction with this agreement
- Materials & Equipment provided the total \$ value of materials and equipment provided by the Corps
- Corps Labor Hours the total number of hours of staff time provided by the Corps. This
 number will later be auto-multiplied by an average \$\$ of a park ranger hourly rate to get the
 dollar value.
