# **Train to Tram Project**

### City of The Dalles and the Chamber of Commerce

### MOU signed 2012

- \$400K grant from Federal Transportation Administration to complete trail grading, trail pavement, bridge improvements, and barrier placement.
- City received additional grants to purchase electric trams/shuttles to replace tour train and promote tourism to boost local economy.
- City owns and operates shuttles and the Chamber promotes tours in the local media, allowing us to resume Park Ranger led tours of The Dalles Powerhouse.



# **Take A Warrior Fishing**

## Catch A Special Thrill - CAST

- MOU signed 2012
  - First event of its' kind held on the Columbia River.
  - CAST provided a broad network of contacts, monetary support, t-shirts, hats, and staff support.
  - Other Sponsors were: All State and Northwest Industrial Supply (provided a BBQ lunch) and Grinder's coffee (provided free coffee coupons).
  - 6 Veterans and their families, plus 7 volunteer boat captains from all over the state participated.



# **Spearfish Family Fishing Clinic**

## U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service

### MOU signed 2008

- Held in conjunction with the state of Washington's free fishing weekend. (no fees or fishing license required)
- WA Department of Fish and Wildlife stocked the lake with 2,000 11-12 inch rainbow trout and 10 8lb trout, 100 free poles and tackle.
- Other sponsors were: Trout Unlimited, Biomark, local stores, bait shops, and restaurants.
- Over **100** participants at this event.





## The Dalles Dam Eagle Watch

### U.S. Forest Service

- MOU signed 2008
  - Forest Service provides staff support and live raptor educational programs.
  - Other partners: Rowena Wildlife Clinic provides live raptors and volunteers.
  - This event has been held annually for the past 3 years and to date it has drawn over 750 visitors.

# Bookstore at The Dalles Dam Visitor Center

## Discover Your Northwest

- Cooperative Agreement signed 2011
  - DYNW provided start-up costs for material and equipment. (Shelving, cabinets, etc.)
  - DYNW oversees major operations such as: ordering merchandise, banking, etc.
  - Our visitor center is open 5 months out of the year. To date we have approximately \$12K in sales and donations. A percentage of which gets donated back to the visitor center for use <u>in-house</u> for educational purposes.







# Safe Kids – USA Columbia River Gorge Chapter

## MOU signed 2009

- ► In 2012 Safe Kids purchased 8 new Life Jacket Loaner Board kiosks and donated them to local parks, marinas, and swim beaches in the surrounding CRG area.
- ► Grand total investment approximately \$10K, including stocks of life jackets for each.
- Other partners: Oregon Department of Transportation loaned us the use of their auger truck for installation.

# Safe Kids – CRG

## Local events USACE and Safe Kids partner together on.

- Cherry Fest
  - Past 2 years over 500 direct contacts
- Children's Safety Fair
  - Past 2 years 600 direct contacts
- ► 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade Safari
  - Past 2 years 535 direct contacts
- ► 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Water Safety Poster Contest
  - Past 2 years 278 poster entries
  - Safe Kids purchases the bags (posters) and prizes (life jackets) which is \$160.00 investment/year.



# **Vessel Safety Checks**



## U.S. Coast Guard

- MOU signed 2005
  - Other partners: state, county, and local police as well as state parks, fish and wildlife, state marine boards, and intertribal agencies.
  - Since we began 3 years ago, we have inspected over 75 boats, and prevented New Zealand Mud Snails from entering the John Day River.

# Road Improvements – Spearfish Park

## Port of Klickitat

- ► MOU signed 2009
  - Federal Transportation Administration grant application to pave Port of Klickitat owned road leading into Spearfish Park.
  - Grant submittal \$188k Port matches 13.5%
  - Approximately 1 mile of pavement over a current gravel road
  - Installation of vehicle gate on Port of Klickitat property
  - Other Partners: Bonneville Power Administration due to a power line easement.



## Northwest Youth Corps

## Northwest Youth Corps

- Cooperative Agreement signed 2009
  - They provide labor in exchange for 7k per week for overhead cost
  - 2011 work at Celilo Park and The Dalles Lock and Dam
  - 60 youth put in 2,400 hours of service providing a value of service at \$51,264.








## Gorge Safe Kids offers life jackets at loaner boards

It's now free to keep kids safe on the water with a life jacket from one of 20 life jacket loaner boards along the Columbia, Willamette and Rogue Rivers.

The local life jacket stations were established through a partnership of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Columbia Gorge Safe Kids Coalition, as well as other cooperating organizations.

"We installed nine this summer," said Amber Tilton of the Corps, including one at The Dalles Riverfront Park.

Safe Kids had the kiosks made over the winter and they were installed this spring and summer.

"It was a collaborative effort," Tilton said. "We had to get permission from all the managing agencies (Port of Hood River, Port of The Dalles, and Washington State Parks)."

The stations include a variety of jacket sizes and instructions to fit a jacket properly. Borrowers are asked to return the jackets when they have finished recreating.


Nearby locations where life jackets can be borrowed include The Dalles Marina, The Dalles Riverfront Park, Celilo Park, Mayer State Park, Heritage Landing at the mouth of the Deschutes River and LePage Park on the Oregon shore in Wasco and Sherman counties, and Columbia Hills State Park and Maryhill State Park on the Washington shore in Klickitat County.

Other sites in the Columbia Gorge include Hood River Waterfront Park and Hamilton Island Boat Ramp at Bonneville Lock and Dam. Plymouth Park near Hermiston also have one of the stations.

Drowning is preventable so please recreate safely by following these helpful tips: always wear a life jacket, learn to swim well, always swim with a buddy, learn "Reach-Throw-Row-don't Go" rescue techniques, take a safe boating class, and never drink and boat.

"Don't think that drowning only happens to other people or other people's children," says Melissa Rinehart, Portland District's water safety coordinator. "Remember that children are happiest when they are safe. If you love them, put them in a life jacket; because they love you, wear yours."
