

# 2025 PARTNER REPORT TO THE U.S. ARMY CORPS OF ENGINEERS

For decades, the Student Conservation Association (SCA) has assisted the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) in protecting, sustaining, and improving our nation's natural and human-made environment. In the process, together we have provided transformative service opportunities for young people from every community in the country. Last year, 55 SCA participants rendered over 31,000 hours of service at 17 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers facilities.

- **GPS Surveys:** multiple sites utilized SCA members to update geospatial databases in support of USACE recreational assets
- **Water Safety:** boat patrols, safety presentations, and interpretative assistance at lakes and waterways across the country
- **Wildlife Surveys:** SCA participants worked in the Environmental Stewardship Section of the Willamette Valley Project (WVP) monitoring, trapping, and tracking sensitive wildlife species

We look forward to continuing our support of U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in 2026 and beyond.

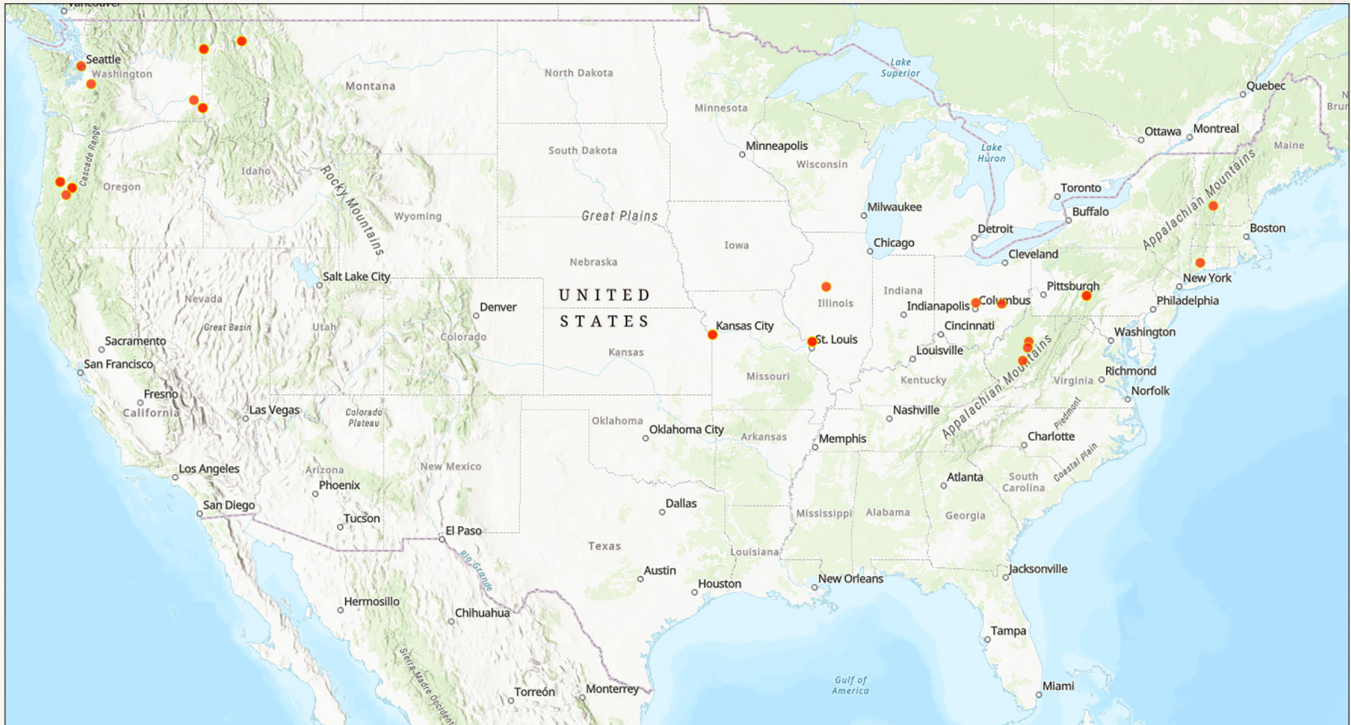
