

Starting October 9, 2022, Ms. Allison Walker joined the HQUSACE NRM Team, serving as the Federal Lands Transportation Program (FLTP) Manager. This role focuses on collaboration with DoT's office of Federal Lands Highways (FLH) to implement the FLTP, Federal Lands Planning Program (FLPP), Emergency Relief for Federally Owned Roads (ERFO) and other transportation programs to improve transportation infrastructure on USACE public lands.
